## Shoreline Master Plans and Comprehensive Plan Updates

The City of Shoreline is taking the first steps toward developing master plans for transportation, surface water, and parks, recreation and open spaces. The City is also updating its Comprehensive Plan and its environmental regulations.

### Master Plans Look to the Future

Master plans look at the whole system - whether it is for transportation or surface water - to identify problems, prioritize needs and develop long-term solutions that are in line with community priorities and what the City can financially afford.

### Plans Work Together

When Shoreline's Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 1998, some elements needed further development, such as transportation, stormwater, and parks, recreation and open space. The City is now ready to create master plans for each of these areas. The master plans will be under the umbrella of Shoreline's Comprehensive Plan and comply with the land use and growth assumptions laid out in the Comprehensive Plan.

### Moving Forward

The City is at the first stage of developing these master plans and updates. We are on a fast-track and need your involvement now to help the plans best reflect the needs of the community.

### Your Input is Important

An important part of master planning is hearing from the community. You drive on the roads, play in the parks, and see where water goes during rainstorms. The City needs your help to identify problem areas, suggest solutions, and weigh-in on what our community's priorities should be over the coming years.
