PROSECUTING ATTORNEY

Violations of the Shoreline Municipal Code are prosecuted in Shoreline Municipal Court. Prosecution services are provided through a contract with a private law firm. The City Attorney administers this contract.

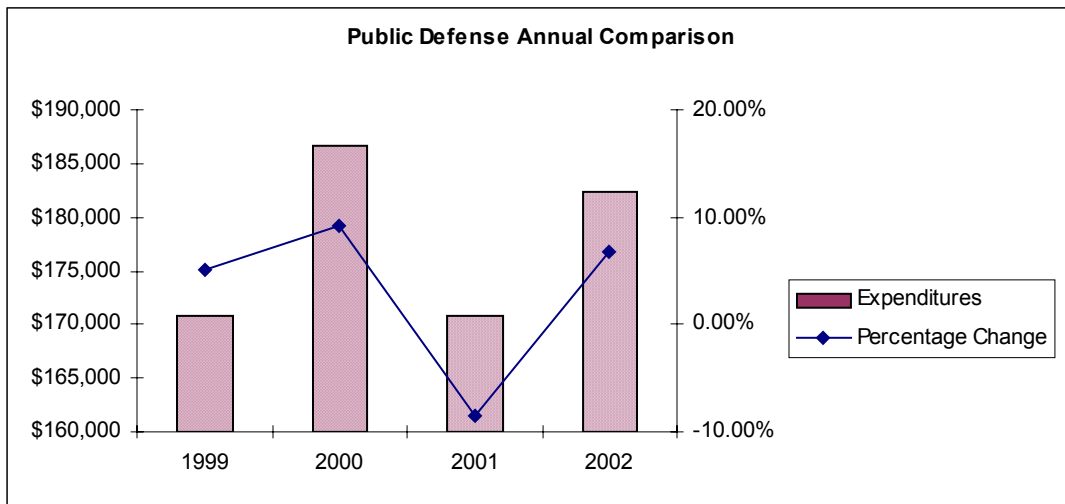


2002 Key Division Objectives

PUBLIC DEFENSE

This program ensures legal representation to indigent criminal defendants as required by law. The Office of Health and Human Services monitors the contracts for public defense, indigency screening and domestic violence services.

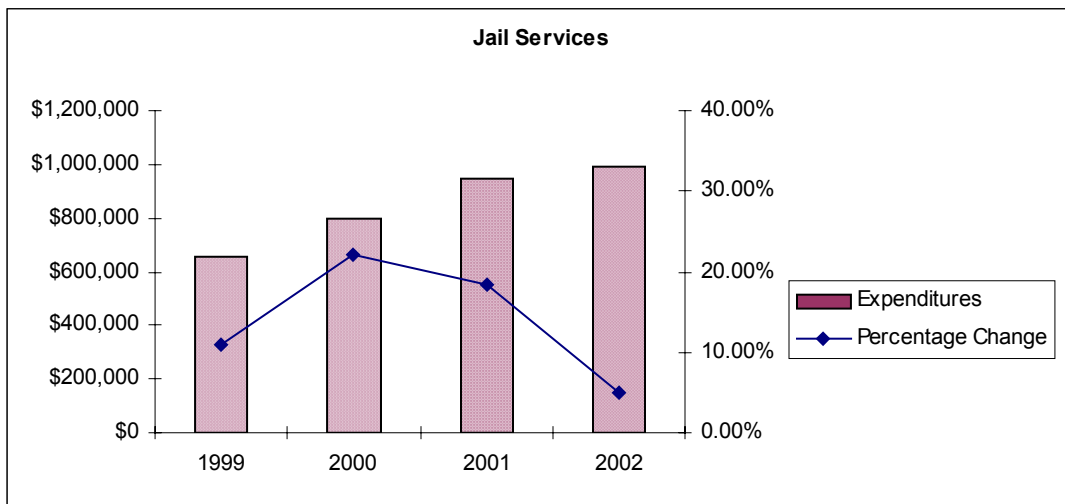


2002 Key Division Objectives

JAIL SERVICES

This is a year-to-year contract with King County's Department of Adult and Juvenile Detention, providing booking, screening and daily maintenance for individuals awaiting trial or sentenced by the Municipal Court.

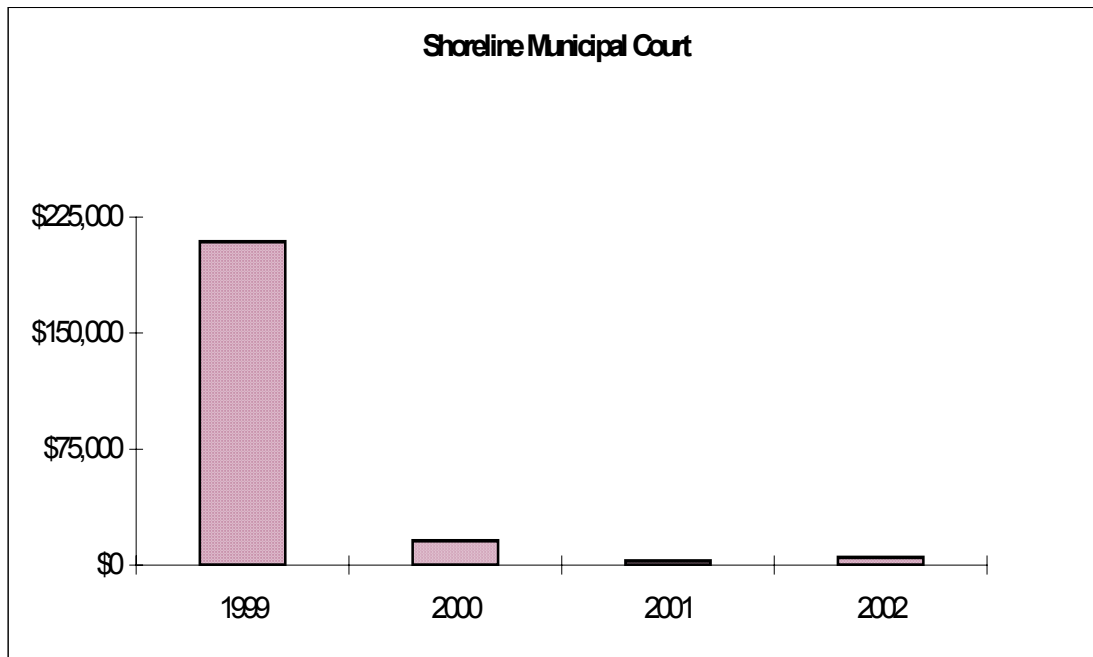


2002 Key Division Objectives

- ◆ Implement new jail services contract with King County.
- ◆ Contain jail services costs by determining the most cost-effective policies and practices to ensure individual accountability and maintain community safety.

SHORELINE MUNICIPAL COURT

The City contracts with King County District Court to provide municipal court services for the City of Shoreline. In 1999, Shoreline along with other King County cities renegotiated the Court contract. The result of the new court contract was that beginning in 2000 the City would no longer directly pay for court services but would instead share revenue with the County as full payment for court services. The City is still responsible for paying half of jury fees and all witness fees associated with Shoreline cases.



2002 Key Division Objectives

- ◆ Work with District Court staff to develop efficiencies to manage the caseload within the current number of court days.
- ◆ Reduce failure to appear rates and improve case processing times.
