Sponsoring a Train-the-Trainer seminar is easy! The seminar is eight hours long and includes overviews of each of the nine components of the *Take a Stand Against Bullying* curriculum. Seminars are limited to 80 participants which allows for interactive discussions, as well as other group activities. The training is presented by curriculum authors Sgt. Michelle Bennett and Deputy Jessica Sullivan.

The host agency/district will be responsible for the “actual costs” of the officers’ time, travel costs and material reproduction costs. The City of Shoreline will provide an estimate in advance and then bill the host agency post training. Within the State of Washington, travel fees include mileage, per diem, and hotel costs. Outside of Washington, travel fees include airfare, hotel, and per diem. Course materials include a three ring binder and a CD containing the curriculum which all participants receive upon completion of the seminar. We will provide master copies of each and it is up to the host agency to reproduce these materials.

Host agencies/districts may charge participants an admission fee to offset the costs of sponsoring the seminar, however it is our hope that this training can reach the most people for the least cost.
