This proclamation recognizes April 22, 2010 as Earth Day in Shoreline. It calls upon residents to celebrate this 40th Anniversary of Earth Day by committing to protect our natural environment for ourselves, our children and future generations.

One recent successful example of the City's commitment to building a healthy environment and sustainable community is the collaboration between the Peterka family and the City, which rewards single family households that reduce waste to very small amounts, with a very low cost 10-gallon monthly garbage collection service option with CleanScapes. In addition, the Peterka's are a model for sustainable stewardship by leading the construction of a community garden at the former Aldercrest School, fundraising for the homeless, as well as job sharing and bartering for services.
