PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

Staff is requesting that Council authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with the Washington State Department of Ecology (DOE) to obligate \$781,386 of Statewide Stormwater Grant Program Funds for the Aurora Corridor Project (N 192nd Street to N 205th Street).

In February 2012, the City was awarded the DOE grant for stormwater related elements. The DOE grant has a 75% participation rate. In accordance with the City's purchasing policies, Council authorization is required in order for staff to obligate grant funds exceeding \$50,000.

RESOURCE/FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Aurora Corridor Project (N 192^{nd} Street – N 205^{th} Street) is identified in the City's 2012-2017 Capital Improvement Program. The following table provides a summary of the funding sources for this project, and the item under consideration is highlighted in bold.
