PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

Staff is requesting that Council authorize the City Manager to execute an interlocal agreement with King County to obligate \$4,800,000 of Federal Transit Authority (FTA) Grant Funds for the Aurora Corridor Project (N 192nd Street to N 205th Street).

The City was awarded the FTA grant funds as part of the King County Very Small Starts program for construction of the Business Access/Transit (BAT) lanes. In accordance with the City's purchasing policies, Council authorization is required for staff to enter into an interlocal agreement.

RESOURCE/FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Aurora Corridor Project (N 192nd Street – N 205th Street) is identified in the City's 2012-2017 Capital Improvement Program. The following table provides a summary of the funding sources for this project, and the items under consideration are highlighted in bold.
