ORDINANCE NO. 134

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON **ADOPTING** CLASSIFICATION A AND **COMPENSATION** PLAN **FOR** CITY EMPLOYEES, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO IMPLEMENT AND ADMINISTER SAID PLAN, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 43, AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SALARY SCHEDULE FOR EMPLOYEES WORKING FOR THE CITY ON OR AFTER THE DATE OF INCORPORATION

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline was incorporated in August of 1995; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 25, adopted August 7, 1995, the City Council authorized the City Manager to implement interim compensation and pay policies for City employees; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 43, passed August 15, 1995, the City Council adopted a salary schedule for City employees working for the City on or after the date of incorporation; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to incorporation, new employees have been hired to staff the departments and divisions of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has recognized the need to adopt a more permanent job classification and compensation plan for City employees; and

WHEREAS, following a national solicitation for requests for proposals to develop a classification plan for the City, the firm of Ralph Andersen & Associates was selected to develop said plan; and

WHEREAS, Ralph Andersen & Associates has developed a job classification and compensation plan for the City, and the City Council desires to adopt said plan and provide for its implementation;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Adoption of Plan. The job classification and compensation plan attached hereto, a copy of which has been filed with the City Clerk and identified with Clerk's Receiving No. 422 is hereby adopted.
 - Section 2. Repeal. Ordinance No. 43 and Resolution No. 25 are superseded.

Section 3. Authorization. The City Manager is authorized to implement and administer the job classification and compensation plan consistent with applicable laws and City policies.

Section 4. Publication. This ordinance, or a summary thereof, shall be published in the official newspaper of the City and shall become effective five days after publication.
