2015 Council Goal Setting Workshop

Every year, the Council holds an annual workshop for your goal setting exercise as well as for other topics. The annual workshop is typically held in the Spring. Staff would like Council to discuss when you would like to hold your annual workshop, along with a discussion on a location and a focus for the workshop (outside of Council's traditional goals setting task.)

Staff recommends that Council hold your annual workshop on either:

- Friday, February 27 and Saturday, February 28, or
- Friday, March 20 and Saturday, March 21.

Staff also recommends that your annual retreat be held at the Cedarbrook Lodge in SeaTac. In researching various venues, Cedarbrook is a good distance away from Shoreline, without being too far, and also provides a nice set of amenities and overnight accommodations onsite. Information about Cedarbrook is attached to this memo as Attachments A and B.

Also attached to this memo is a *potential* draft agenda for your annual workshop (Attachment C). The agenda includes some of your typical workshop items, including prior year review and accomplishments, review of current Council goal work plan and new goal setting, and workshop wrap up.

Workshop Team Building Activity

Also included in the draft workshop agenda is a team building activity on Friday afternoon. Inclusion of this item was something Council provided direction on at your last Council operations dinner meeting. In researching various team building activities and briefly discussing this with the Mayor and Deputy Mayor, staff came up with a few ideas but is recommending a cooking activity at Blue Ribbon Cooking (http://www.blueribboncooking.com/corporate-teambuilding). This activity, called "Cooking for a Cause", would last for two hours, with the

first 30 minutes entailing arrival and drinks/appetizers, and the second hour and half entailing a hands on cooking activity in Blue Ribbon's kitchen to create three different dishes which will be donated to a local shelter by Blue Ribbon staff. This activity will hopefully achieve both Council's desire to form stronger working relationships and an even more cohesive team, and provide an outcome for those in need in our community.

Entities Warranting Five Minutes of Speaking Time During Council Public Comment A question has come up recently regarding Council Rule of Procedure 6.1, which regards public testimony at a Council Business Meeting. Specifically, this rule states, among other considerations:

"... When representing the official position of a State registered non-profit organization or agency of a City-recognized organization, a speaker will be given five minutes (as opposed to three) and it will be recorded as the official position of that organization. Each organization shall have only one, five-minute presentation."

Staff has observed some individuals that request five minutes for public comment may belong to an organization that may not be an active State registered non-profit. There is also a question regarding what "City-recognized organization" means. While the City has defined "City-sponsored organization" to mean an organization that is either sanctioned by the City (i.e., Neighborhood Associations, Council-appointed committees (Parks Board), etc.) or an organization that receives funding from the City (i.e., Shoreline-Lake Forest Park Arts Council), staff is not aware of a definition for a "City-recognized organization" or a listing of these organizations.

Given this, staff would like to discuss with Council if this is an issue that Council would like staff to help address, and if so, whether the solution should be administratively handled, whether there should be an amendment(s) to the Council Rules of Procedure to better define when an individual should receive five minutes of public comment time, or both.
