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Council will be joined by Sound Transit (ST) Chief Executive Officer Peter Rogoff (CEO Rogoff) for the February 27 Dinner Meeting. Staff has worked with Sound Transit staff to develop an agenda for Council's first meeting with CEO Rogoff.

The agenda includes the following:

- An opportunity for CEO Rogoff to discuss his background and his philosophy
- His goals for Sound Transit
- Provide an update on Sound Transit's work on ST2 and ST3
- Facilitate a discussion on agency partnerships, access enhancements for ST projects, and how ST will develop a partnership strategy moving forward.

This conversation is intended to be a high level discussion between partner agencies.

As you know, the City has been working closely with Sound Transit staff on the Lynnwood Link Extension project which includes two light rail stations in Shoreline. Work is continuing with the goal of beginning construction in late 2018 and completing construction and system testing in time for service on the Lynnwood Link extension starting in late 2023. The City and ST are working together on all levels of planning, permitting, and oversight to ensure a successful project.

With the passage of ST3, the City will also be working closely with Sound Transit to implement the improvements on 145th in anticipation of the SR 522/523 Bus Rapid Transit line. Those improvements and associated bus rapid transit service is scheduled to begin in early 2024, in close conjunction with the opening of the Lynnwood Link Light Rail extension in late 2023. That project is anticipated to begin work on planning and

design within the year to meet the ambitious schedule. The ST Board will be considering the overall project delivery schedule at its April board meeting.

Both agencies view these projects as a governmental partnership, different than a more common developer-city permitting project. In particular, both agencies have a goal to ensure that there is easy, safe non-motorized and transit access as part of every project within Shoreline.

While ST2 projects include some funding for access to transit projects, ST3 also contained a separately funded 'Access' pot of money to be utilized system-wide on ST3 projects. Sound Transit staff is working with the ST Board to develop a strategy for developing partnerships around this issue. CEO Rogoff will share their ongoing thinking and strategies around access enhancements, partnerships with cities, and how he would like to proceed with partners like Shoreline to implement this strategy on ST3 projects.
