Several of Shoreline's high school sports teams have just completed very successful seasons.

- The Shorewood Boys Tennis Team had an undefeated season and is sending three entrants to the state championships in the spring.
- Both the boys and girls cross country teams from Kings High School won the state championship, the first time both the boys and girls teams repeated as state champions.
- The Shorecrest Girls Volleyball team won the district championship and league title, going through the season undefeated in league play, and participated in the state playoffs.
- The Shorewood Girls Soccer team also won the district and league titles and went to the state championships, having outscored their opponents 45 – 9.

The coaches and representatives of these teams will be at the December 9th Council meeting to receive proclamations honoring their various achievements.
