WHEREAS.

when the armistice ending World War I was signed on November 11,

1918, more than 4.7 million Americans put down their arms and returned

- to their everyday lives--this event was initially commemorated as Armistice Day; and

 WHEREAS, in 1954, the Congress renamed the day as Veterans Day to recognize all those who have served in our Armed Forces; and

 WHEREAS, there are currently 26.4 million veterans in the United States, about 13 percent of U.S. civilians 18 years of age or more; and

 WHEREAS, currently 1.6 million veterans are women, 2.6 million are black, 1.1 million are Hispanic, 284,000 are Asian, and 196,00 are Native Americans; and
- WHEREAS, our military has built a great tradition of courageous and faithful service from World Wars I and II to the Korean and Vietnam wars, to the Persian Gulf and our troops serving in Iraq and Afghanistan; and
- WHEREAS, today our veterans inspire new generations of Americans to fight tyranny and help bring freedom to countries around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronald B. Hansen, Mayor of the City of Shoreline, on behalf of the Shoreline City Council, do hereby proclaim November 11 as
