## **PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:**

The City Manager presented the 2009 proposed budget to the City Council on October 13, 2008. Department presentations were made on October 20 and October 27 and a public hearing was held on October 27. A budget workshop was held on November 3. Tonight we will hold a public hearing on the proposed budget with special emphasis on revenue sources and the 2009 property tax levy. Tonight's workshop provides another opportunity for the Council to discuss the proposed budget and for staff to provide Council with any additional information that may be helpful to the Council during budget deliberations. The City Council is scheduled to adopt the 2009 Budget at the November 24, 2008 Council Meeting.

Chapter 251, Laws of 1995, passed by the State Legislature, requires the City Council to hold a public hearing on revenue sources for the next year's budget. The hearing must include consideration of property tax revenues and must be held before the property tax levy ordinance is passed and submitted to King County. The City of Shoreline is required to adopt its 2009 levy ordinance and certify the amount to the County Assessor by November 30, 2008. The 2009 Proposed Budget includes a recommended one percent property tax levy increase plus new construction.

As prescribed in Shoreline Municipal Code (SMC) 3.01.080 fees shall automatically be updated annually by the July to June Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U). For 2009 this means that the City's fees should be increased by 5.8%. After applying this increase to the hourly rate for development fees they will increase by \$8 per hour from \$137 to \$145. Recreation fees were reviewed for inflationary adjustments and market comparison. As a result of this review, the 2009 proposed budget recommends a market adjustment for some recreation fees and continuing the use of direct and indirect costs to establish recreational class rates. The surface water fees have been increased by 5% instead of the full CPI-U. As basin plans are completed over the next couple of years more information will be available to determine the capital and operating needs of the utility that ultimately will be used to determine future utility rate fee adjustments. The 2009 annual residential home surface water utility fee will be \$130, a \$6 increase from the 2008 fee.

The City's contract with CleanScapes, Inc. provides for an annual adjustment to the collection fee component of solid waste rates. The adjustment is based on the composite change in three indices that measure the change in inflation, labor, and fuel costs. Adjusted rates become effective on March 1<sup>st</sup> of each year with customers being notified no later than January 15<sup>th</sup>, forty-five (45) days prior to the new rate taking effect. Since the solid waste utility is considered the City's utility in which we have chosen to contract with a private provider, the solid waste rates are being incorporated into the City's fee schedule for the first time in 2009. CleanScapes, as the contractor for the service, is responsible to collect the fees.

Attachment A is the proposed 2009 fee schedule along with a comparison to the 2008 current fees. The fee schedule will be adopted at the same time the Council adopts the 2009 budget, which is currently scheduled for November 24, 2008.

Attachment B is the proposed 2009 CleanScapes fee schedule along with a comparison to the 2008 current fees.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Proposed 2009 Budget totals \$104,077,571. The total resources used in the proposed 2009 Budget equal \$104,077,571. Property tax represents 8.75% of the overall City resources in the amount of \$9,136,509 which includes both the regular levy and the bond levy. Utility taxes and contract payments account for 7.39%, \$7,686,602 of the City's revenues. Fees and charges represent 6% of the City's overall resources and total \$6,295,127.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that Council conduct the public hearing to take public comment on the proposed 2009 property tax levy and proposed 2009 revenues. Staff also recommends that Council continue discussion on the 2009 Proposed Budget and provide input to staff.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City collects a variety of revenues to support the ongoing services provided. The following discussion provides detail on the City's major funding sources.

## **General Fund Revenues**

### **Property Tax**

**Regular Levy:** In 2001 voters approved Initiative 747 (I-747) in a statewide election. Although I-747 passed on a statewide level, it did not pass within the City of Shoreline. Shoreline voters voted 53.7% to 46.3% against I-747. The provisions of I-747 limited property tax levy increases by local governments to the lower of the Implicit Price Deflator (IPD) or one percent without voter approval. The 2009 proposed budget contains a proposed property tax levy that meets the limitations of I-747.

Property tax revenue for the 2009 regular levy is budgeted at \$7,436,509 and represents 24.5% of the General Fund operating revenues. The 2009 revenue is a \$200,281 or 2.8% increase over 2008. This slight increase is a result of new construction and a one-percent recommended levy increase.

Although the 2009 budget provides for increased property tax revenues on a real basis, when adjusted for inflation and presented on a constant dollar basis, the City has had property tax revenue growth below inflation since 2001.

The projected regular tax levy rate for 2009 is \$0.94 per \$1,000 valuation, a reduction from the 2008 rate of nearly 7.8%. The primary reason for the decrease in rate is that assessed value of property in the City has increased at a greater rate than the property tax levy has grown. Statutorily, the City could levy up to a maximum property tax rate of \$1.60 per 1,000 assessed valuation.

**Bond Levy:** Shoreline voters approved a special levy in 2006 to fund the parks improvements and the purchase of open space. The 2009 debt service levy is projected to be \$1.7 million which will result in a levy rate of \$0.21 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. The combined regular and special levy rate will be \$1.15 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for a total combined levy of \$9,136,509.

#### Sales Tax

The 2009 sales tax revenue is expected to increase by 4.42% as compared to the 2008 projections to a total of \$7,090,452. At this level, sales tax revenues will account for 23.5% of the total 2009 General Fund operating revenues. Staff will continue to monitor sales tax trends, as the current economic slowdown may have an impact on 2009 sales tax collections.

#### **Criminal Justice Sales Tax**

A major source of dedicated funding for local criminal justice programs is the County sales tax of 0.1%. The projected 2009 revenue is \$1,361,750 or 4.2% of the total General Fund operating revenues. This is another revenue source that could be impacted by an economic slowdown.

#### **Utility Tax**

The City collects a 6% utility tax on natural gas, telephone services, sanitation services, cable television, and storm drainage. Projected revenues in 2009 from utility taxes are \$4,249,581 or 14.1% of the total General Fund operating revenues. This is an increase of \$141,450 or 3.4% over projected 2008 utility tax revenues of \$4,108,131.

Utility taxes are levied on the gross operating revenues and therefore the effective rate of the tax may be higher than the stated rate of 6% when you are comparing the utility tax charge strictly to the actual charge for service. The table below compares the 6% tax rate on gross revenues to the effective rate on the direct utility fee:

## Public Utility Contract Payments /Franchise Fees

The City has entered into agreements with many of the public utilities that provide services to our citizens. Agreements have been reached with Seattle City Light, Seattle Public Utilities (Water and Sewer), Shoreline Water District, and Ronald Wastewater District. With the exception of Seattle City Light, these utilities pay a contract fee to the City in an amount equal to six-percent of their revenues. Until April 1, 2008 Seattle City Light (SCL) paid six-percent of the "power" portion of the electric revenues. On April 1, 2008, SCL began to pay a 3% contract payment on the "distribution" portion of their revenues. That rate will go to 6% on January 1, 2009 which ultimately results in a 6% payment on total electrical revenues.

The total projected 2009 revenue from contract payments is \$3,437,021, which equates to 11.4% of the total General Fund operating revenues. This is an increase of \$413,758 or 13.69% from projected 2008 revenue. Most of this increase is due to the increase in the Seattle City Light contract payment.

Like utility tax, the effective rate of a franchise fee when compared to the direct utility fee charge will be higher than the rate on the gross revenues. The table below compares the fee rate on gross revenues to the effective rat on the direct utility fee:

#### **Gambling Tax**

Forecasted revenues for 2009 total \$2,008,500, a 0.6% reduction when compared to 2008. This amount reflects a continuing decline in pull tab and card room activity. The projected gambling tax revenue for 2009 equals 6.7% of the total forecasted General Fund operating revenues.

### **Development Permit Fees and Charges**

Fees are charged for a variety of development permits, inspections and reviews obtained through the City's Planning and Development Services Department. These include building, structure, plumbing, electrical, and mechanical permits; land use permits; permit inspection fees; plan check fees; and fees for environmental reviews. In 2009, revenues are projected to be \$1,454,425. This is an increase of \$45,858 or 3.26% over 2008 projected revenues. Again, this revenue source maybe impacted by current economic trend.

## **Recreation Fees and Charges**

Fees are charged for participation in recreational classes and activities; swimming lessons and pool admission; athletic field, recreation center, picnic shelter and Spartan Gym rentals; indoor and summer playground programs; and teen trips and classes. Revenue is projected to total \$1,375,335 which is an increase over 2008 projections or \$64,122 or 4.89%.

## **Street Fund Revenues**

The City receives revenue from state collected fuel tax and right of way fees to fund street maintenance activities. These revenues do not provide sufficient funding therefore the General Fund continues to subsidize this fund. The total subsidy for 2009 is projected to be \$1,778,145.

#### **Fuel Tax**

State collected gasoline and diesel fuel tax is shared with cities and towns on a per capita basis. This revenue is to be used for street and arterial street repairs and maintenance. The projected revenue for 2009 of \$1,251,030 shows a very modest increase of just \$10,687 or 0.86%. The tax is a flat amount per gallon sold. Since receipts in this category are dependent on consumption, and not price, the significant increase in gas prices has decreased the amount of fuel sold

The City will continue to deposit 56% of the state distribution into the City's Street Fund for ongoing street maintenance activities. The remaining 44% will be deposited directly into the Roads Capital Fund to support the annual road surface maintenance project.

## **Right-of-Way Permit Fees**

Fees are charged for the use of the City's right-of-way. This revenue source is affected by the level of construction activity occurring within the City. As history shows, collections can vary slightly from year to year based on the level of activity. 2009 revenue is expected to increase by only \$23,907 to \$173,907. This revenue offsets the cost to provide the right-of-way inspection service.

## **Surface Water Utility Fund**

The City contracts with King County to collect the surface water fee via the annual property tax assessments. 2009 collections are expected to increase to \$3,103,688.

#### Capital Improvement Fund Revenues

Capital projects are funded from a variety of revenue sources including: real estate excise tax, fuel tax, grants, debt financing, investment earnings and funds that the City has set aside for capital projects.

#### Real Estate Excise Tax (REET)

All real estate property sales in the county are taxed at a rate of 1.28%. A portion of these revenues, equal to a 0.5% tax rate, is distributed to the cities by King County on a monthly basis. The use of REET funds is restricted by State law. The first 0.25% of the REET tax rate must be spent on capital projects listed in the City's Comprehensive Plan. These projects could include local capital improvements, including streets, parks, pools, municipal buildings, etc. The second 0.25% of the REET tax rate must be spent on public works projects for planning, acquisition, construction, reconstruction, repair, replacement, or improvement of streets roads, highways, sidewalks, street lighting, etc.

2009 revenues are projected to increase over 2008 projections by \$316,660 or 22.62%% to \$1,716,660 as current economic projections are for the current real estate crisis to bottom out by the end of 2009. This is down significantly from collections received over the past few years when real estate activity was occurring at a record pace. Collections reached a peak in 2005 at just over \$2,675,632.

### **Capital Grants**

In 2009, Shoreline is projected to receive \$20.7 million in grant funding from federal, state and local sources to fund a variety of capital projects. The majority of these grants are related to the Aurora Avenue North Improvements – 165<sup>th</sup> to 205<sup>th</sup> project. Grants are applied for and received for specific capital improvements. The amount of capital grants received in any given year can vary greatly depending on the number of projects, their cost and the amount of grant funding available.

### **Proposed Changes to City's Fee Schedules**

SMC 3.01.080 prescribes that fees shall automatically be updated annually by the July to June Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U). For 2009 this means that the City's fees could be increased by 5.8%.

## Land Use & Non-Building Permit Fees

The land use and non-building permit fees are based on an hourly rate. Applying the 5.8% CPI to the current rate raises the hourly rate from \$137 to \$145. Building permit fees are based on the value of construction. Therefore, inflationary increases in valuation are automatically taken into account within the fee calculation. Plan check fees are based on the building permit fee and therefore no adjustment is needed to these fees

#### Recreation Fees

Recreation class fees are based on the direct cost of providing the program plus an overhead allocation. There is no change proposed in how these fees are determined. Aquatic fees, facility rental fees, and other general recreation fees have been adjusted based on market comparisons to other jurisdictions and inflationary factors. The 2009 budget also includes a recommendation to increase the scholarship allotment from \$35,000 to \$45,000.

#### Surface Water Fees

Surface water management fees are proposed to be increased by \$6 or 5% for a single-family home. The current annual fee for a single family home is \$124. The proposed rate for 2009 is \$130. Multi-family and commercial users are charged at a rate that reflects the area of impervious surface. These rates will be increased by the same percentages as single-family residence rate.

In 2005, the City Council adopted a Surface Water Master Plan. This plan includes operational needs and capital projects for the next twenty years to improve drainage, surface water facilities, and stream habitat within the City. This plan included a surface water utility fee structure that would support both the operational and capital needs of the utility. Beginning in 2008, the plan called for annual increases of approximately 3% or one half percent above the assumed rate of inflation. Since the plan did not assume an increase in inflation substantially higher then 3%, the City Manager did not want to recommend a 6.3% (5.8% plus an additional 0.5%) increase for 2009. In 2008 the City started working on the Thornton Creek basin plan and in future years additional basin plans will be completed. These basin plans will provide additional information to formulate the capital and operational needs of the utility and be the basis for establishing future utility rates.

#### License and Public Record Fees

License fees and the hearing examiner fee have been increased from the 2008 rates by 5.8%. There will be no increase in the public records fees such as photocopying and obtaining recordings and publications on DVD or CD.

#### Solid Waste Fees

The City contracts with CleanScapes to provide solid waste (garbage) services to the Shoreline community. The contract with CleanScapes provides for annual adjustments to the collection service charges based on a composite index or three indices that measure changes in inflation, fuel, and labor costs. The disposal component of the garbage fees are not changed by this index, but rather are based on costs from King County, and no change is being proposed in the current rates.

The index used to adjust the collection service charges was included in the City's Request for Proposal for solid waste services, so this adjustment was standardized for all potential service providers. Also this formula is used by most other cities using private contractors in adjusting their solid waste rates from one year to the next. Since the time the City Council approved the CleanScape contract the indice used for labor was eliminated and replaced with a very similar measurement. On November 24, 2008, the City Council will be asked to modify the contract to include the new indice. The three indices used to calculate the composite change in service collection fees and their respective weights are:

- 1. The first-half annual consumer price index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton (CPI-W) (June to June) 42%
- Energy Information Agency annual West Coast Retail Price Series for On-Highway Diesel Fuel (Average of 12 month period of November through October) – 8%
- 3. Employment Compensation Cost Index for Private Industry for service providing industries (June to June) 50%

The resulting composite change using this formula is 6.5% for 2009. Since this applies only to the service component of the garbage rates, the overall average increase in weekly service rates for residential customers is 4% and for weekly service rates for commercial and multi-family rates is 4.6%.

Adjusted rates become effective on March 1<sup>st</sup> of the following year with customers being notified no later than January 15<sup>th</sup>, forty-five (45) days prior to the effective date of the new rate. The solid waste rates are being incorporated into the City's fee schedule for the first time in 2009. CleanScapes, as the contractor for the service, is responsible to collect the fees.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that Council conduct the public hearing to take public comment on the proposed 2009 property tax levy and proposed 2009 Revenue. Staff also recommends that Council continue discussion on the 2009 Proposed Budget and provide input to staff.

- \* A discount for any parcel served by a City approved retention/detention (R/D) facility maintained by the owner.
- \* A discount for any parcel, or part parcel officially designated as open space.
