AGENDA TITLE: Shoreline Library Board Appointments DEPARTMENT: Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services PRESENTED BY: Dick Deal, PRCS Director

ISSUE STATEMENT:

On March 31, 2010, the terms of Shoreline Library Boardmembers Susan Hoyne, Lori Lynass and Tom Peterson expire. By Ordinance, members are allowed to serve up to two consecutive four-year terms. Ms. Hoyne was appointed in 2006 and has completed one four-year term. As a result Ms. Hoyne is eligible to be re-appointed. Mr. Peterson and Ms. Lynass have also only served one term, but did not submit applications by the deadline to be considered for re-appointment.

In addition, Boardmember Maria Peterson submitted her resignation from the Board in January with two years remaining on her four-year term.

The Library Board openings were advertised on the City website, on Channel 21 and were announced at City Council meetings. All interested citizens were encouraged to apply by January 29 and seven applications were received.

On February 24th a Council subcommittee comprised of Mayor McGlashan, Councilmember Chris Eggen, and Councilmember Shari Tracey conducted interviews of all seven candidates. The subcommittee is recommending the following citizens be appointed to fill the vacant positions.

Two-year term	Jennifer Hannibal

The Council subcommittee wishes to thank all citizens who expressed interest in serving the community as members of the Shoreline Library board.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

In the 2010 Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services budget there is \$700 allocated for Library Board supplies, training, travel and dues.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council appoint Susan Hoyne, Sara Lorimer, and Corey Murata to four-year terms, and Jennifer Hannibal to a two-year term with all terms beginning April 1st 2010..
