## PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

Staff is requesting that Council authorize the City Manager to execute a contract with Universal Field Services, Inc. for right-of-way acquisition services for the Aurora Corridor Improvement Project (N 192<sup>nd</sup> – N 205<sup>th</sup> Streets) in the amount of \$895,000.

The Aurora Corridor Improvement (N. 192<sup>nd</sup> to N 205<sup>th</sup> Street) environmental work is complete and design is at the 30% milestone, which is the appropriate time to begin right-of-way acquisition. Universal Field Services, Inc. (UFS) will lead the right-of-way acquisition work and their team will include: the appraisal firm McKee & Schalka, review appraiser Joe Granger and the site renovation/evaluation firm of Gram Sage Graves.

The specific services the UFS right-of-way acquisition team will provide during the right-of-way acquisition phase of the project include:

- Public Outreach and Property Owner Meetings
- Title Ownership Review
- Project Funding Estimate (PFE) Creation
- Appraisal and Appraisal Review
- Site Renovation and Demolition Review
- Acquisition Negotiation
- Relocation
- Parcel Closeout Escrow Closing
- Mediation

UFS was selected through a competitive formal process, and requests for qualifications were advertised in June 2007. Six firms submitted qualifications to provide right-of-way acquisition services for the Aurora Corridor N 165th–N 205<sup>th</sup> Streets Project. Three firms were interviewed. Staff believes UFS continues to perform at a high level and recommends that the City continue to utilize the firm for this segment of the project.

#### **SCHEDULE:**

Environmental work between N 165<sup>th</sup> to N 205<sup>th</sup> Streets is complete. The Aurora Corridor Improvement Project N 165<sup>th</sup> to N 185<sup>th</sup> Streets (Mile 2) Segment is currently under construction. Construction of the N 185<sup>th</sup> to N 192<sup>nd</sup> Street (Mile 3A) Segment is fully funded and is anticipated to begin in October 2010, pending right-of-way acquisition. Both of these segments are anticipated to be complete the summer of 2011 (weather permitting). Design for the N 192<sup>nd</sup> to N 205<sup>th</sup> (Mile 3B) Segment is currently at the 30% milestone and final design will begin this summer with the 60% design milestone attained by the end of the year.

Currently, there is insufficient funding to complete design, right-of-way acquisition and construction of the N 192<sup>nd</sup> to N 205<sup>th</sup> segment. Staff estimates that there are 54 larger parcels to acquire real property in Mile 3B. The right-of-way cost estimate is approximately \$7.5 million for the property needed for the project footprint. This does not include purchase of uneconomic remnants. Staff estimates that the purchase of uneconomic remnants could significantly increase the project's right-of-way acquisition costs, which has been estimated at another \$6.1M. When seeking funding, staff will use the estimate of \$13.6 million for right-of-way costs.

To date, the City has received approximately \$5.5 million for right-of-way acquisition. Instead of waiting until additional funding is acquired, staff believes it is important to begin the acquisition process for parcels deemed to be complicated: multiple owners (condominium complexes), unique site configurations, and building/significant parking impacts.

To move forward with right-of-way acquisition for Mile 3B, this summer the right-of-way team will begin coordination with the Washington State Department of Transportation real estate group and we will submit to them the Project Funding Estimate (PFE). At this point, right-of-way funds can be obligated. This summer and through the fall, the design and right-of-way team will meet with **ALL** property owners to review the preliminary design and discuss the right-of-way acquisition process. Once these meetings are complete, staff will have a better understanding of which parcels to begin acquisition.

Below is a table showing the current schedule projection for the entire Aurora Corridor Improvement Project (N 165th to N 205th Streets).

### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

The N  $165^{th}$  – N  $185^{th}$  and N  $185^{th}$  to N  $192^{nd}$  Streets segments are fully funded. The N  $192^{nd}$  – N  $205^{th}$  Streets segment is not fully funded at this time. There are sufficient funds to complete the 60% level design and to negotiate and acquire a portion of the needed right-of-way. Additional funding is still required to complete design, right-of-way acquisition and construction. There is currently \$5,528,000 in grant funding for right-of-way acquisition for the N  $192^{nd}$  to N  $205^{th}$  Streets segment. This will provide staff the option to begin negotiations and some acquisitions on properties that are felt to be more complicated. Staff is actively seeking additional funding for the N  $192^{nd}$  – N  $205^{th}$  Streets segment. Below is a breakdown on the funding for the entire N  $165^{th}$  – N  $205^{th}$  Streets segment.
