PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT: Staff is requesting that Council authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with the Washington State Department of Ecology (DOE) to obligate \$624,243 of Stormwater Retrofit and Low Impact Development (SWRLID) Grant Funds for the Aurora Corridor Project (N 185th Street to N 192th Street).

In accordance with the City's purchasing policies, Council authorization is required in order for staff to obligate grant funds exceeding \$50,000.

In November 2010, the City was awarded the SWRLID grant for stormwater related elements. A key requirement of this grant is the DOE grant can only be used for rain garden and other Low Impact Development construction of the Aurora Corridor Project between N 185th Street and N 192nd Street.

## FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Aurora Corridor Project (N 185th to N 192nd Streets) is identified in the City's Proposed 2011-2016 Capital Improvement Program. The following table provides a summary of the funding sources for this project, and the items under consideration are highlighted in bold.
