PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

In February 2012, a Council subcommittee was created to make recommendations on appointments to the Shoreline Library Board. This subcommittee was comprised of Mayor Keith McGlashan, Deputy Mayor Chris Eggen, and Councilmember Chris Roberts. The subcommittee reviewed 13 applications for appointment to five Library Board positions.

The vacancies were a result of the completion of two full terms by Mary Lynn Potter, the end of the first terms of Sara Lorimer, Tom Moran and Sidney Strong and the mid-term resignation in late 2011 by Jenny Hannibal, who moved from Shoreline. Mr. Moran and Mr. Strong chose not to reapply for the board.
