At 5:53 p.m., the meeting was called to order by Mayor McGlashan, who presided.

Mayor McGlashan began the meeting by discussing a King County proposal to the Sound Transit (ST) Board to include N. 175<sup>th</sup> Street in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) as an alternative light rail station site.

Councilmembers then reported on their outreach efforts to various government officials regarding the proposal.

The Council then discussed the format and strategy for the upcoming Sound Transit Board meeting. Mr. MacColl advised the Council on strategy, noting the importance for the Council to clearly express what the City wants from Sound Transit.

There was further discussion about the specific wording of the proposal and the process for making motions before the ST Board. The Council and staff then discussed the advantages and disadvantages of station alternatives and further discussed outreach efforts. It was noted that the desired outcome from the ST meeting is for KC Councilmember Philips to withdraw his amendment.

At 6:50 p.m., Mayor McGlashan declared the meeting adjourned.
