PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

The City must adopt its budget for 2013 by December 31, 2012. Ordinance No. 650 adopts the 2013-2018 Capital Improvement Plan; 2013 Proposed Budget including the City's appropriations for 2013; the 2013 salary schedule; the 2013 fee schedule; and the 2013 portion of the 2013-2018 Capital Improvement Plan as the 2013 Final Budget.

Department presentations were made on October 22 and November 5. Presentation of the 2013-2018 Proposed Capital Improvement Plan was made on November 5. Public hearings on the 2013 Proposed Budget were held on November 5 and November 13. A final budget workshop was held on November 19. Throughout this process the City Council diligently exercised its fiduciary and policy setting roles, asking questions and affirming the Council's intentions.

Please note that during final review a minor error in the exempt salary schedule was identified in ranges 33 through 35. The error was corrected, no positions were affected, and there was no effect on the budget.

The fee schedule is being modified to replicate the format of the Shoreline Municipal Code and will be Exhibit B to Ordinance No. 650. Staff is still completing this task, and will provide Exhibit B on Wednesday, November 21. The fee schedule that was reviewed on November 5 can be found at this link:

Since this report is being distributed prior to the meeting on November 19, any changes to the proposed budget that are recommended by Council during the November 19 workshop will be included in the final ordinance that will be presented to the City Council for adoption this evening.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The 2013 Proposed Budget totals \$67,049,762 with the General Fund totaling nearly \$34.2 million (including use of fund balance and transfers in from other funds). The

2013-2018 Proposed Capital Improvement Plan is balanced as required by the Growth Management Act and totals \$63.4 million. The General Capital Fund totals nearly \$12.3 million; City Facilities/Major Maintenance Fund totals \$594,160; Roads Capital Fund totals nearly \$42.6 million; and Surface Water Utility Fund capital projects total \$7.9 million.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that Council adopt Ordinance No. 650, adopting the 2013-2018 Capital Improvement Plan and establish fund appropriations, the salary schedule, and the fee schedule for the year 2013.

ORDINANCE NO. 650

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE FOR THE YEAR 2013 AND ADOPTING THE 2013-2018 SIX YEAR CAPITAL FACILITIES PLAN

WHEREAS, State law, Chapter 35A.33 RCW requires the City to adopt an annual budget and provides procedures for the filing of a proposed budget, deliberations, public hearings, and final fixing of the budget; and

WHEREAS, the Growth Management Act, RCW 36.70A.070(3) and .130(2), requires a six –year plan for financing capital facilities (CIP) to be amended concurrently with the adoption of the city budget; and

WHEREAS, a proposed budget for fiscal year 2013 has been prepared and filed, public hearing have been held on November 5 and November 13, 2012 for the purposes of fixing the final budget including a public hearing on revenues held on November 5, and the City Council has deliberated and has made adjustments and changes deemed necessary and proper; now therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. 2013 Budget Adopted. The 2013 Final Budget for the City of Shoreline for the period January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013 as set forth in the 2013 Proposed Budget, is hereby adopted.

Section 2. Summary of Revenues and Expenditures. The budget sets forth totals of estimated revenues and estimated expenditures of each separate fund, and the aggregate totals for all such funds, as summarized as follows:

Section 3. Repeal, New Chapter. Shoreline Municipal Code Chapter 3.01 *Fee Schedule* is repealed and a new Chapter 3.01 *Fee Schedule* is adopted as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto.

Section 4. CIP adoption. The *Capital Improvement Plan (2013-2018)* is adopted as set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto.

Section 5. Copies of Budget to be Filed. The City Clerk is directed to transmit a complete copy of the Final Budget as adopted to the Division of Municipal Corporations in the Office of the State Auditor and to the Association of Washington Cities as required by RCW 35A.33.075.

Section 6. Severability. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, or should any portion of this ordinance be preempted by state or federal law or regulation, such decision or preemption shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 7. Effective Date. A summary of this ordinance consisting of its title shall be published in the official newspaper of the City. The ordinance shall take effect and be in full force January 1, 2012.

N. FEE REFUNDS

The city manager or designee may authorize the refunding of:

1. One hundred percent of any fee erroneously paid or collected.

2. Up to 80 percent of the permit fee paid when no work has been done under a permit issued in accordance with this code.

3. Up to 80 percent of the plan review fee paid when an application for a permit for which a plan review fee has been paid is withdrawn or canceled before any plan reviewing is done.

4. The city manager or designee shall not authorize refunding of any fee paid except on written application filed by the original permittee not later than 180 days after the date of fee payment.

In determining whether a waiver should apply, the director of the animal care and control authority must take into consideration the total amount of the fees charged as compared with the gravity of the violation and the effect on the owner, the animal's welfare and the animal care and control authority if the fee or fees or penalties are not waived and no payment is received.

There are two types of service charges: The flat rate and the sliding rate.

The flat rate service charge applies to single family homes and parcels with less than 10% impervious surface. The sliding rate service charge applies to all other properties in the service area. The sliding rate is calculated by measuring the amount of impervious surface on each parcel and multiplying the appropriate rate by total acreage.

B. CREDITS

Several special rate categories will automatically be assigned to those who qualify

- 1. An exemption for any home owned and occupied by a low income senior citizen determined by the assessor to qualify under RCW 84.36.381.
- 2. A discount for any parcel served by a City approved retention/detention (R/D) facility maintained by the owner.

4. Alternative Mobile Home Park Charge. Mobile Home Park Assessment can be the lower of the appropriate rate category or the number of mobile home spaces multiplied by the single-family residential rate.

C. RATE ADJUSTMENTS

Any person receiving a bill may file a request for a rate adjustment within two years of the billing date. (Filing a request will not extend the payment period).

Property owners should file a request for a change in the rate assessed if:

- 1. The property acreage is incorrect;
- 2. The measured impervious surface is incorrect;
- 3. The property is charged a sliding fee when the fee should be flat;
- 4. The person or property qualifies for an exemption or discount; or
- 5. The property is wholly or in part outside the service area.

3.01.800 Fee Waiver

The city manager or designee is authorized to waive use fees for right-of-way permits (SMC 3.01.010), facility use fees and concessionaire permits (SMC 3.01.030), and meeting rooms (SMC 3.01.032) as a city contribution toward events which serve the community and are consistent with adopted city programs. The city manager is authorized to designate collection points in the City Hall lobby, pool, or Spartan Recreation Center for any charitable organization without charge to be used for the donation of food or goods that will benefit Shoreline residents in need.

3.01.820 Annual Adjustments

The fee schedules in this chapter shall be automatically updated on an annual basis on January 1st of each year by the Seattle Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U). The adjustment shall be calculated each year and included in the city manager's proposed budget. The annual adjustment shall be based on the CPI-U average for the period that includes the last six months of the previous budget year and the first six months of the current budget year. The city manager may choose to not include annual CPI-U adjustments in the city manager's proposed budget and the city council may choose to not include annual CPI-U adjustments in the adopted budget for select user fees in any individual budget year without impacting the full force of this section for subsequent budget years. The annual adjustments to the fees in this chapter shall be rounded to the nearest quarter-dollar.
