At 5:59 p.m., the meeting was called to order by Mayor McGlashan, who presided. He introduced Mr. Dembowski, King County Councilmember, who provided some personal background and explained his committee assignments.

Mr. Dembowski then outlined his goals and priorities as they relate to the City of Shoreline, including: a strong economy; infrastructure; transit, METRO service; human services; environmental and Growth Management Act (GMA) issues; the courts, law enforcement, and public defense. He emphasized the need for the County to be a good partner with suburban cities.

The discussion then turned to Shoreline-specific issues, such as acquisition of Brugger's Bog Maintenance Facility and light rail station area development. Mr. Dembowski then provided an update on METRO Rapid Ride, noting that the project timeline will be delayed in order to ensure it is done right. The meeting concluded with a discussion about the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Levy.

At 6:55 p.m., Mayor McGlashan declared the meeting adjourned.
