## PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

During the course of the year, the City received grants and other revenues that should be included in the 2013 budget along with the corresponding expenditures. These new revenue sources were not anticipated when the 2013 budget was developed and adopted by Council. Amendments are also required due to unanticipated costs in the General Fund and the General Capital Fund. Ordinance No. 676 amends the 2013 budget to incorporate these new revenues and expenditures. This is a routine procedure that occurs at approximately this time each year.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Ordinance No. 676 totals \$628,918. The following programs will be impacted by this amendment:

#### **INTRODUCTION**

During the course of the year, the City received grants and other revenues that should be included in the 2013 budget along with the corresponding expenditures. These new revenue sources were not anticipated when the 2013 budget was developed and adopted by Council. Amendments are also required due to unanticipated costs in the General Fund and the General Capital Fund.

#### BACKGROUND

The following section provides the detail for the budget amendments in Ordinance No. 676:

#### General Fund

**Revenues:** General Fund revenues will be increased by \$259,238. This includes a King County Project Rampart – EMS Grant totaling \$3,000; an Urban Forestry Grant from the Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) totaling \$10,000; an Emergency Management Performance (EMP) grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security totaling \$61,235; a Coordinated Prevention Grant (CPG) from the Washington State Department of Ecology totaling \$95,850; a grant from the Washington State Department of Shoreline Environmental Assistance of \$5,000; and unanticipated right of way fees of \$84,153.

**City Wide Non-Departmental:** The 2013 appropriation will be increased by \$193,625 to cover the cost of the 2013 General Election and voter registration. The county has historically billed the City for election costs in the following fiscal year and as such the anticipated costs for the 2013 election and voter registration activities have been included in the 2014 proposed budget. The County recently notified the City that due to improvements in their billing process, they will now be able to bill the City paid for the costs of the 2012 General Election and for voter registration. This will result in the City paying twice for election costs during 2013. Available fund balance will be used to cost \$85,000 and voter registration costs are estimated at \$108,625. Funding included in the proposed 2014 budget will be used for 2014 election and voter registration costs.

**Police Patrol:** The 2013 appropriation will be increased by \$3,000 to include a grant award from the King County EMS Project Rampart program. The grant has been used to purchase three automated external defibrillators (AED) to be placed in patrol vehicles.

**Parks Administration:** The 2013 appropriation for this program will be increased by \$10,000 to use the proceeds from an Urban Forestry Grant received from the WA State DNR to be used to develop an Urban Forestry Strategic Plan.

**City Planning**: The 2013 appropriation for this program will be increased by \$5,000 to use a grant from the Washington State Department of Ecology Shoreline Environmental Assistance program to update the City's Shoreline Master Program.

**Community Services – Emergency Management Planning**: The 2013 appropriation will be increased by \$61,235 to use EMP grant funding to purchase equipment for the Emergency Operations Center (\$23,090); to fund 50% of an Administrative Assistant to support program activities (\$36,545); and for staff training (\$1,600).

**Public Works – Environmental Services**: The 2013 appropriation will be increased by \$95,850 to use CPG funds to support events for the collection of recycling and hazardous materials.

**Public Works – Right of Way:** The 2013 appropriation will be increased by \$84,153 to fund unanticipated staff and extra help costs along with training and supplies to provide right of way inspection services. This increase will be covered by additional right of way fees as a result of the increased level of activity.

**General Fund Transfers Out**: The 2013 appropriation is being increased by \$83,909 to include a one-time transfer of \$70,000 to the General Capital Fund of street vacation funds designated for open space purposes to be used for the purchase of available open space property. The transfer to Fund 211- Limited Tax GO Bond 2009 -has been increased by \$16,646 to provide additional funding for debt service payments. The City was recently notified that since sequestration reductions will continue into the next federal fiscal year, the Build America Bonds subsidy scheduled to be received on December 1, 2013 totaling \$193,185 will be reduced by \$13,909. The June 1, 2013 subsidy payment was also reduced by \$16,807 due to the sequestration for a total impact this year of \$30,716.

The net impact to the General Fund 2013 expenditure appropriation is an increase of \$536,772. The increase in expenditures is partially offset by the increase in revenues totaling \$259,238. Available fund balance totaling \$277,534 will be used for the rest of the increased appropriation. The street vacation proceeds designated for open space purposes are part of the fund balance being requested for appropriation.

#### Public Arts Fund

**Revenues**: Revenues will be increased by \$5,500 to include a grant from the King County 4-Culture Group Arts Projects Program.

**Public Arts Projects**: The 2013 appropriation will be increased by \$5,500 to reflect the use of the grant to fund the Piano Time Street project.

#### General Capital Fund

**Revenues**: Transfers In from the General Fund will be increased by \$70,000 as available street vacation proceeds designated for open space acquisition in the General Fund will be transferred to the General Capital Fund.

**Paramount Open Space Acquisition**: A 2013 appropriation of \$70,000 will be established in this project for the purchase of property available east of the Paramount Open Space. Council approved the property purchase on October 7, 2013.

## Roads Capital Fund

**Revenues: Revenues:** Revenues will be increased by a School Zone Safety Grant from the Washington State Traffic Safety Commission totaling \$16,646.

**Traffic Safety Improvements:** The 2013 appropriation will be increased by \$16,646 to purchase and install school zone flashing lighting at Kellogg Middle School, Ridgecrest Elementary, Briarcrest Elementary, Meridian Park Elementary, Parkwood Elementary and the Evergreen School.

## FINANCIAL IMPACT

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 676**

#### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 650 BY INCREASING THE APPROPRIATION IN THE GENERAL FUND, THE PUBLIC ART FUND, THE GENERAL CAPITAL FUND AND THE ROADS CAPITAL FUND.

WHEREAS, the 2013 Budget was adopted in Ordinance 650; and

WHEREAS, the 2013–2018 Capital Improvement Plan was adopted in Ordinance 650; and

WHEREAS, new grants have been awarded to the City not anticipated when the 2013 budget was adopted by Council and should be appropriated to the General Fund, Public Art Fund, and Roads Capital Fund; and

WHEREAS, unanticipated costs require increases in appropriations in the General Fund and the General Capital Fund; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to appropriate a portion of the greater than budgeted beginning fund balance in 2013 to fund the unanticipated costs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Shoreline is required by RCW 35A.33.00.075 to include all revenues and expenditures for each fund in the adopted budget; and

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 650. The City hereby amends Section 2 of Ordinance No. 650, the 2013 Adopted Budget, by increasing the appropriation from the General Fund by \$536,772; for the Public Art Fund by \$5,500; for the General Capital Fund by \$70,000; for the Roads Capital Fund by \$16,646; and by increasing the Total Funds appropriation to \$73,728,847 as follows:
