ISSUE STATEMENT:

On January 20, 2014 the nation celebrates Martin Luther King Jr. Day. Dr. King's message of peace and service and his dream of pursuing a world free from prejudice and injustice lives on and has not been forgotten since his tragic death in 1968.

This proclamation recognizes the impact of Dr. King's contributions on our nation, state, and community, and urges Shoreline citizens to reflect on our common goals and celebrate his life and his ideals of freedom and justice for all.

Representatives of the Ballinger Teens, with City staff support from Christy Vien, Teen Programs Assistant in the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Department, will receive the proclamation. Just this past week, the Ballinger Teens group visited the "RACE" exhibit at the Pacific Science Center and participated in pre and post workshops on the exhibit. Their remarks this evening reflect the thinking and commitments they have undertaken in response to this experience and exposure to elements of the history of race in the United States.

The Ballinger Teens are active participants of The Shoreline Youth & Teen Development Program at Ballinger Homes. These teens meet once a week to participate in enriching recreation activities and volunteer opportunities. Their involvement in this program helps strengthen their community and allows them to have new experiences to engage with the larger community.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Mayor read the proclamation and present it to representatives from Ballinger Teens.
