ISSUE STATEMENT:

This proclamation recognizes April 22, 2015, as Earth Day in Shoreline. It calls upon businesses and residents to celebrate this 45th Anniversary of Earth Day by committing to protect our natural environment for ourselves, our children, and future generations.

One successful example of how Shoreline's residents and businesses are willing to change their habits, in order to create a sustainable environment, is their support of the City's 2014 carryout bag ban. During this past year, they have taken their reusable bags to the store when they go shopping, reducing the need for additional natural resources to produce paper and plastic bags. By recycling the plastic bags and plastic packaging materials they receive, residents and businesses also protect the turtles, gray whales and other wildlife in our oceans.

To acknowledge and celebrate all of the actions that individuals do every day in Shoreline to protect our environment, the City thanks you and invites everyone to see a life-sized gray whale that children in Olympia constructed with plastic bags. This event will also feature informational materials about how and why the trash, including plastic bags, that ends up in the ocean can be consumed by whales or other wildlife. The Whale will be available for viewing in a location yet to be confirmed from March 30 until April 27.
