PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

In years past, the Shoreline Police Department and Community Services Division joined with the National Association of Town Watch in sponsoring "National Night Out" in Shoreline on the first Tuesday of August. Out of concern for the health and safety of our community during the COVID-19 pandemic, the National Association of Town Watch recommends that National Night Out be postponed in 2020. Thus, in Shoreline, there will unfortunately be no organized National Night Out this year, including no permits for street closures or block party registrations.

If small groups of neighbors choose to gather, the City of Shoreline encourages residents to follow current guidelines for numbers of people who can assemble, wear masks, practice social distancing, and take all necessary precautions.

Recognizing that residents may have gotten to know their neighbors better than before, the City of Shoreline encourages building stronger relationships with the people in closest proximity. A new Talent Bank template is now available on the National Night Out page on the City website. This is a tool for neighbors to share information with each other so they can create a safer, more responsive community.
