# PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

On June 11, 2007, staff presented the proposed 2008 – 2013 CIP to the City Council. The following schedule is being followed to facilitate the adoption of the 2008 - 2013CIP and the TIP.

Tonight, the City Council will have an opportunity to discuss the proposed CIP.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Proposed 2008 – 2013 CIP is balanced as required by the Growth Management Act and totals \$172 million. The General Capital Fund totals \$32.9 million; City Facilities/Major Maintenance Fund totals \$340,000; Roads Capital Fund totals \$120.4 million; and Surface Water Utility Fund capital projects totals \$18.3 million. Attachment A is a summary of the proposed 2007 – 2013 Capital Improvement Plan. The TIP consists of the Roads Capital section of Attachment A.

## PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

On July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2007 the Advisory Committee for the King County Flood Control Zone District will conduct a formal vote and thereby make a recommendation to the County Council on a district CIP and levy amount. Shoreline Council member Ron Hansen has been appointed as a member of the Advisory Committee and is representing suburban cities. Council discussion and direction is requested for our representative to the Advisory Committee.

In April of this year, the County Council formally approved the legislation to form a county wide flood control district with the intent to begin collecting revenue January 1, 2008. In order to meet this deadline, the Assessor must have the assessment amount in early August. To establish the assessment, the County Council formed an Advisory Committee to recommend a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), what form of assessment (e.g. mil levy, special assessments, tiered levy, combinations, etc.) and the amount of the levy.

The County Council has the ability to assess a mil levy via councilmanic up to a 50 cent mil. The Advisory Committee has been studying mil options (some with special assessments, service charges, etc.) that range from 5 cents to 12 cents. The central issue is how to assess county properties; one flat levy applied against all assessed valuation, or a tiered approach to the assessment. Since the vast majority of the CIP is in the lower end of the river basins where much of the flood problems persist, up-stream cities like Shoreline, Federal Way, Bellevue, Maple Valley and Seattle will likely see little physical improvements with a single, flat levy. The issue quickly focuses on the degree to which this is considered a regional issue.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council review the forthcoming King County Flood Control Zone District recommendation and provide our Advisory Committee representative direction for the July 20th committee vote.
