PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

RCW 35.77.010 law requires that all cities, towns, counties, and transit agencies review and revise their Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) annually. plan needs to be submitted to the Washington State Department of Transportation before August 1, 2002. A public hearing must be held prior to adoption by resolution of the revised and extended TIP. The TIP will serve as the Roads Capital Fund section of the City's 2003 - 2008 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) that will be submitted to Council for review.

The annual TIP update and adoption with a public hearing and by resolution is a state and federal requirement. The TIP is used to allocate federal and state funding. The City of Shoreline's TIP is incorporated into the Puget Sound Regional Council's (PSRC) adopted TIP and Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The TIP lists all the transportation projects. A project must be included in the local agency's (City, County or Transit Agency) TIP in order to be eligible for Federal or State Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) funding. A public hearing will also be required for the adoption of the TIP and will be scheduled as part of the CIP Process on July 8, 2002.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Roads Capital Fund of the 2003 – 2008 CIP provides specific information pertinent to the revenues and expenditures associated with the TIP. A combination of financial resources including grants and other City funds will be utilized to fund each of the projects identified in the TIP. By identifying projects in the TIB, staff will be able to apply for additional grants to supplement the City's resources.

RECOMMENDATION

No action is required at this time on the Proposed 2003 –2008 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program for the City of Shoreline.
