PROBLEM/ISSUE STATEMENT:

October has been recognized across the country as National Arts and Humanities Month. In June 2004 the United States Conference of Mayors passed a policy resolution urging cities to proclaim Arts and Humanities Month in their own communities. Such proclamations acknowledge that the arts and humanities are an invaluable part of the life of our citizens. Additionally, the nonprofit arts industry generates \$134 billion annually and provides jobs for the equivalent of 4.85 million people. Locally, institutions such as the Shoreline Historical Museum and the Shoreline/Lake Forest Park Arts Council work diligently to bring the benefits of the arts and culture to our community.

In addition to acknowledging the efforts of all the arts and cultural organizations to promote the cultural and intellectual life of our community, the proclamation also encourages greater participation by our citizens in the programs and projects brought forward on behalf of the arts and humanities.

The Executive Director of the Shoreline History Museum, Victoria Stiles, and the Executive Director of the Shoreline/Lake Forest Park Arts Council, Ros Bird, will attend the meeting to accept the proclamation.
