- WHEREAS, by educating ourselves and working together, we will improve our ability to prevent, detect, and treat breast cancer and ultimately find a cure for this silent killer; and
- WHEREAS, in the City of Shoreline, the Shoreline Junior Chamber is undertaking a fund-raising project this week to make a contribution to this worthy effort;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronald B. Hansen, Mayor of the City of Shoreline, on behalf of the Shoreline City Council, do hereby proclaim October 2004 as
