Shoreline Council hears updates on City programs, services

At its May 1 meeting, the Shoreline City Council heard presentations from the executive directors of the Shoreline Historical Museum and the Lake Forest Park Arts Council and received an update from the City's Street Maintenance Team.

Shoreline Historical Museum and Shoreline Lake Forest Park Arts Council

Vicki Stiles, Museum Director of the Shoreline Historical Museum, and Ros Bird,

Executive Director of the Shoreline Lake Forest Park Arts Council, each presented a report to

Council on 2005 programs and activities. They also previewed events for 2006 such as the

Museum's monthly hands-on drop-in program for children that is held the fourth Saturday of

every month and the Arts Council's Art Festival set for June 24 and 25 at the Shoreline Center.

The City Council authorized \$63,525 in the 2006 Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services budget

for each of the organizations.

Streets Maintenance Update

The City of Shoreline Street Maintenance unit was established under the Public Works

Department in 2000 to improve service and response time to residents. The unit maintains, repairs

-MORE-

and improves the City's streets, rights-of-way, street trees and drainage in addition to responding to storm events and preparing the roads for resurfacing each year. The unit also manages contracts and capital projects.

The Street Maintenance Unit will complete the following projects this year:

- Overlay 5.1 lane miles of City streets and slurry seal 6.2 lane miles.
- Replace 3,774 square feet of sidewalk.
- Update 55 curb ramps to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
 - Replace 239 feet of curb and gutter.
 - Clean 3,000 catch basins.
