The City of Shoreline is undertaking a corridor study of the 145th St Right-of-way in order to address the safety and traffic problems inherent there and to propose improvements. One of the options the City is studying is a road widening the size of 8 traffic lanes, including sidewalks, turning lane and bike lanes. This would require up to 10-20ft of property acquisitions by eminent domain!

- How will your home or property be affected? • What are your rights?
- What actions should you take or the neighborhoods take?
- Do bike lanes even belong on 145th? • Or would they be safer on the side-streets?
