

DID YOU KNOW?

Radical Rezone

The Shoreline City Council rezoned over 375 acres of single-family neighborhoods for high-density development over a mile wide. This is 345 more acres than even Sound Transit recommended for the area immediately near the 185th Street light rail station.

High Density

Density in the radical rezone area will go up 18 times: from 2.7 units per acre to 48, eliminating 3000 Single-family Homes, their yards and trees.

High Rises Next Door

The radical rezone allows developers to build 7 story buildings in quiet, stable single-family residential neighborhoods. So instead of tall trees, it will be tall buildings.

Think There's Congestion Now? Just Wait

At full build-out, the population in the radical rezone area could soar past 56,000 – more than the City's entire population today.

Lack of Planning

All this new development will need expensive services, including fire protection, schools, water, sewer and drainage. The City has failed to spell out how the services will be provided and how they will be paid for.

No Parks, No Tree Protection
No additional parks are planned as yet in the radical rezone area, and thousands of existing healthy mature trees and wildlife habitat in that area are subject to removal, with no

Who Pays?

Developers will get tax exemptions for 12 years. But the rest of us taxpayers will be on the hook to pay for the needed services.

No Notice, No Answers

requirements for replacement.

The City gave residents less than two weeks notice by mail of the radical rezone. The City Council ignored questions from hundreds of concerned citizens at hearings. It gets worse. The public will be excluded from participating in decisions about future developments in the radical rezone area.
