145TH STREET STATION SUBAREA PLAN PLANNING PROCESS RESUMES

- Light rail service is coming to Shoreline in 2023 with two stations on the east side of I-5 at 185th and 145th Streets.
- The City is evaluating land use changes for the area surrounding the station at 145th. The planning process for the 145th Street subarea began in 2013, but was postponed in 2015 in order to study possible improvements to the 145th Street corridor.
- On April 7, the Planning Commission will hold a public hearing at 7:00 p.m. at Shoreline City Hall on the zoning scenarios studied in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIS). The Draft EIS studied potential impacts and mitigations of each scenario with regard to traffic, parks, schools, utilities, and the environment, among other things.
- **Next steps:** The Planning Commission will recommend and City Council will select one zoning scenario for further study in the Final EIS.
