**Subject:** Fircrest Campus Tour Thank You and formation of a Community Stakeholders' Group for Fircrest Campus Master Plan including Nonprofits

Dear Capital Programs Director Hubenthal:

Thank you so very much for an informative tour of the Fircrest Campus in Shoreline yesterday. Even though I've visited it for the past 18 years, I was able to see it in a new, fresh way including the history of the campus as well as the amount of work DSHS staff has poured into it to keep Fircrest School open. I especially appreciate you staying much beyond the hour we had planned for the meeting.

As you heard from Lorie, I think forming a Community Stakeholders' Group for Fircrest Campus Master Plan including Nonprofits is a great idea.

It will help inform your two community outreach meetings later this year and I believe will help us make sure we have win-win-win solutions for this once-in-a-generation opportunity:

- What does DSHS need to plan ahead and build in the NW and NE parts of the campus? (These are my ideas let's talk)
  - o Short term: Lease Renewal Amendment with DNR for NW portion for the new Nursing Facility
  - o Long term: Permanent ownership of land identified as DSHS-dedicated use
  - Parking structure in north campus needed for current and future uses while preserving as much of the significant trees as possible (need 60+)
  - Upgrade water and sewer services; improve fire response
    - North City Water
    - Shoreline Fire (with increased density in south Shoreline, need a second fire station hopefully in SE section of Shoreline)
    - City of Shoreline/Ronald Sewer
    - Is Fircrest energy-independent or do we need Seattle City Light at the table?
    - Broadband provider
    - Anything else?
- What are the Community Interests?
  - A Master Plan for Fircrest Campus that is comprehensive
    - A comprehensive development plan and a sense of community that positively impacts eventual development of private lots to the south between 150<sup>th</sup> & 145<sup>th</sup> along 15<sup>th</sup> Ave NE
  - o Balance increased density and added new uses with community wishes for
    - Active Recreation Areas
    - Preservation of the Chapel
    - Preservation of Significant Trees
    - Increased services for the DD and elderly including appropriate language and cultural practices
      - Increased beds for transitional services from hospitals to community setting
      - Respite care
      - Senior Daycare
      - Other services the new residents of Fircrest Campus would need
- What are the Opportunities Non-Profits can add to the community-at-large by co-locating on the Fircrest Campus (timeline: 3-10 years)?
  - Housing (identified so far): Rep. Ryu/Rep. Chopp's goal of adding 400 affordable and specialized housing/living units
    - KinOn assisted and independent living units for multi-language Asian population as well as a community center
    - ShoreLake Arts launching feasibility for a new live-work artists' housing, shared community/performance center, commercial kitchen/restaurant space
    - King County Housing Authority including housing for DD population
    - Other populations?
  - Community Center with a Commercial Kitchen and Non-Profit Office Space: Use and Operations
    - Volunteers of America WW follow the successes of the Lynnwood Neighborhood Center, Carl Gipson Senior Center
      operating agreement with City of Everett, etc. for multi-generational, multi-ethnic, synergistic co-location of human
      services
    - Senior Day Programming/Day Care/Meals on Wheels
      - Shoreline Lake Forest Park Senior Center will need a new home once the Shoreline Conference Center is repurposed (5 legislative offices and ShoreLake Arts will also need new homes)
    - KinOn
    - ShoreLake Arts
  - Performing Arts and a Gathering Place
    - ShoreLake Arts Restaurant and Café
  - Need Parking for State Health Lab and increased use/density in south campus
- What are the State's Interests including DNR?
  - Manage redevelopment of the Fircrest campus so as to maximize revenue to the trust that benefits state institutions including DD facilities, and the Dan Thompson Account (which is used for DD services and facilities in the community)
  - o Structure management and on-going operation of the active use of the DNR land (in south campus) for the next 50 years.

Shoubee and I will set up the first Zoom meeting which I hope you will be able to attend. Please feel free to let Shoubee know anyone else that could add to the conversation, whether they choose to participate in the developments of the campus or not.

I also welcome additions/improvements to the points I've sketched out above. Have a wonderful rest of the day!
