This is a weekly update of what your Shoreline PD has been up to:

- Saturday Night, I attended the Korean Association of Seattle's 55th Arirang Celebration. Translated from Korean to English "Arirang" means "my beloved one". This celebration was held to honor the accomplishments and contributions of First Responders during the pandemic keeping our communities safe. I was joined by many dignitaries including but not limited to Chief Nelson from Lynnwood PC and Chief Kang from Mukilteo, our State representative, the King County Prosecutor elect, Leesa Manion, and several KC mayors. Mayor Scully challenged the many young people in the room to consider a career in law enforcement to give back to their communities in service. I only wish my officers could have all been present as they deserve recognition much more than I do for their service to this honorable profession.

I writing you today with a brief note regarding my encounter with Officer Mores Gluaymai Na Ayadhaya on Friday evening, October 2.

After being home most of the day, I ventured out on my bicycle just to enjoy the cold, Autumn evening. As is true most days, only usually much operating systems were not up to my usual climb. So I got off, moved from the bike path to the snow-laden sidewalk, and very slowly trudged up eventually, somewhere east west of Dayton Ave. N., I returned to the street as close as I could get to the curb, so that I'd be on bare pavement, bike light flashing and watched closely for the traffic behind me.

At some point Officer Mo approached behind me, in her police car, and apparently tried to get my attention, but due to the traffic noise I couldn't nonauthoritarian tone of voice, she primarily expressed her concern about my safety and listened carefully to my explanation for what I was doin offered to follow me, in her vehicle, up to the next intersection. I have to say this interaction made my day!

The purpose of my writing, Chief Park, is to express to you that, with officers like Ms. Mo, Shoreline has a much better chance of exercising effe many opportunities for this kind of personal and professional growth in all of the officers that you supervise.
