Sherry stated that Marion was suffering hallucinations and thought people were trying to break into her home. Dep. Welch, Dep. Wunderlich, and MHP Sternhagen went to the residence and spoke to Marion, they made sure she was safe and would be able to sleep. MHP Sternhagen followed up with her and ended up speaking with her son, Marc, who stated she had a bad case of sepsis, which was causing the hallucinations. Marc also stated his mom will be moving into an assisted living facility that can better meet her needs.

This is another great example of the compassion Shoreline Deputies display on a daily basis.

Incident Summary

RADAR Navigator Sherry Sternhagen, sent an email praising Deputy Carlos Jurado and how he handled a recent outreach session. Sherry stated Dep. Jurado helped her connect with a life long Shoreline resident who was feeling suicidal and despondent. Sherry said after some follow up, she was able to get the resident connected to resources. Sherry appreciated Carlos's calm presence.

Weekly Graffiti Emphasis

In response to community concerns, CSO Corona is now performing every-Thursday checks of Shoreline parks to identify graffiti that may go unseen during nightly closings. This work is not meant to replace those instances requiring case reports (i.e. malicious harassment, gang, etc.), but rather to help our colleagues in *Parks* address taggings. A weekly report, with photos, is done in Mark-43 to capture this effort.
