
TruNarc Success on the First Day!

Our TruNarc machine is up, running and already paying off!! Wednesday Shoreline Deputies were dispatched to an overdose and learned that someone purchased what he thought was cocaine and began snorting lines of Fentanyl. After immediately overdosing, his friend called 911, which initiated an AED request. Deputy Glavin arrived and began CPR until fire took over and transported. The unknown white powder was secured and brought to the Shoreline Pct. where it was



tested on our fancy new TruNarc machine that revealed the substance was Fentanyl. Thank you Sgt. Fitchett, again for pushing this program through! Day one of it going operational we were able to see that we had powder fentanyl and tested it through the bag without exposing anyone.

Team Effort for Boat Disposal



Disposing of an abandoned boat and trailer takes several steps. In late February, a dilapidated vessel was found dumped on the side of road at N. 170th ST and Aurora Ave. N. Together with City Roads and CECRT crews, Shoreline Police lifted the boat off its junk trailer and placed it on the KCSO Special Ops Unit flatbed trailer. The boat was towed to Ballinger Pumps while the derelict trailer—with no plate and no VIN—was sent directly to the scrap yard.

Sgt. Akers sent a Junk Vehicle Affidavit by certified mail to the last known registered owner of the boat, notifying him of his right to arrange for removal of his boat from the property within 15 days. After the 15-day waiting period expired with no response from the owner, Sgt. Akers submitted a request to King County Solid Waste to obtain a Waste Clearance Letter. Next, he set up an appointment with the Cedar Hills Landfill in Maple Valley for disposal. On Wednesday, Roads, CECRT and Shoreline Police delivered the boat, with all the garbage left inside it, to the landfill. The fee for disposal was \$309.17. This was the culmination of hard work and coordination between the City of Shoreline, the KCSO Marine Unit, and Shoreline Police Department. Special thanks to Sgt. Barton with the Marine Unit for providing the flatbed trailer and for his help with towing.
