

## **Chief's Message**







Nearly every week, Chief Park and I receive *internal* commendations from peers and supervisors recognizing efforts of both deputies and detectives.



We thanks those of you performing this exceptional work *and* your colleagues & sergeants who recognize and report it. This is just one quality the makes Shoreline the special precinct it is.

On 07/13/2023 at 2239 hrs Deputy Swanson and Deputy Glavin were responding to an unrelated radio call when they saw an assault in progress on the S/E side of the Keybank building located at 17500 Aurora Ave N. Deputy Swanson and Deputy Glavin took quick action to separate the suspect from the victim and place him in custody. The victim was bleeding extensively from his face and head and had a suspected broken orbital and jaw. Deputy Glavin summoned aid who arrived shortly after and transported the victim to Harborview. The suspect was booked into KCJ for felony assault.

If it wasn't for the quick action of both Deputy Swanson and Deputy Glavin the suspect would have most likely inflicted more injuries on the victim then he already did.
