

Going Above & Beyond - Deputy Ezell



A caller from Arlington, WA reported her son's phone number had been painted inside the home, along with a message telling people to send nude photos. Her adult son has no connection to Kenmore, so she was surprised when she received a call from someone letting them know his phone number was painted on a wall there.



Deputy Ezell went to the vacant house and found the phone number on the wall. He took the initiative to buy paint from a local store and cover the phone number, so she and her son would not get any more harassing calls and texts. By taking these additional steps, Deputy Ezell saved the victims from having to drive from Arlington to paint it themselves. Deputy Ezell went above and beyond to assist this family and saved them a great deal of grief and inconvenience.
