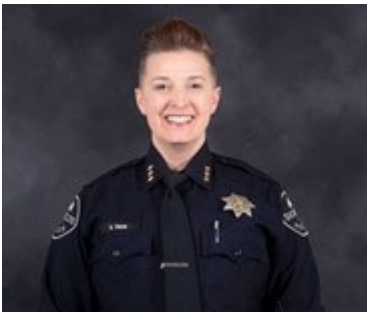

New Comm Center Feature - Call Gate

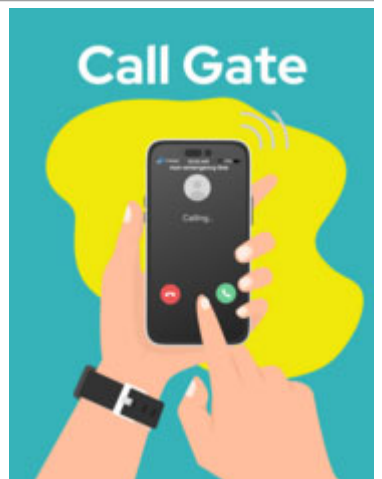
To prioritize emergency calls during staffing shortages, the Comm Center will be using a new feature called Call Gate. Call Gate allows call receivers to put a hold on answering non-emergency calls ONLY. When this feature is in use, callers will hear a recording providing phone numbers for records, gun permits, the civil unit and police reports and then advises the caller the Comm Center cannot answer the non-emergency line at this time.

Call Gate will only be used when the Comm Center is 50% below minimum staffing or during major incidents. It is not intended to be in use for more than two to four hours per implementation.

The Comm Center will send notification to precinct and city administration staff to advise when this feature is in use and will include a non-emergency number that can be used only by precinct and city administration staff during this time.

The Comm Center appreciates the assistance from their administrative partners while they work to improve their staffing situation.
