Successful RCR Engagement

While out on a call, Officer Yamamoto requested our Crisis Responders, John and Melissa, meet a trio of cooperative homeless folks who had been sleeping in church and business parking lots recently. The oldest among them, a woman suffering from MS, was the only person with a disability income. John and Melissa went out with two peer counselors from the Recovery Navigation Program and met with the trio next to a 7-11. They were immediately supplied with warm socks and hats, food and water, hard warmers, and bus tickets.

They accepted an invitation to visit the Community Court resource tables where they met with Deputy Jurado. John and Melissa filled out applications for all



three for the enhanced shelter at the Oakes and emailed the forms to Lake City Partners. They advised them about the tent city option on 145th and gave them a new tent to replace their leaky one. Melissa also donated a warm jacket. Lastly, they were given a new phone with a month of unlimited data and minutes and gift cards for Fred Meyer to pick up any food or supplies that will help them stay warm and fed until they can secure safer housing.
