Kenmore Among WA's Safest Cities

Safewise released the 2024 rankings for the safest cities in Washington. Kenmore ranked fifth, moving up from seventh last year. Safewise identified the safest cities by reviewing 2022 FBI crime report statistics (the most recent complete report available at the time of ranking) and population data. The rankings are based on both violent and property crime numbers. They look at the number of reported violent crimes (aggravated assault, murder, rape, and robbery) in each city and the



number of reported property crimes (burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft).
