Shoreline Fraudsters in Federal Prison

Duo accused of stealing \$435,000 from elderly Shoreline homeowner in repair scam

Two criminals posing as contractors conned a Shoreline man into turning over his life savings for “repairs” to non-existent problems with the roof and foundation of his home. They first approached the homeowner in January 2024, knocking on his door and alerting him to a supposed hole in his roof. They offered to fix the hole and remove moss. They then claimed that victim needed repairs to his foundation, and pressured him into wiring money for labor, supplies and taxes. The thieves ultimately stole \$435,000.

Due to the strong investigative work done by Detective Monserud and great teamwork by additional Shoreline officers and detectives, these criminals — brothers Patrick and Matthew McDonagh — are now behind bars. Ofc. Handley made initial contact with the elderly Shoreline community member and wrote detailed a report. Follow-up investigation by MPO Coblantz and Detective Soderstrom provided additional information vital to the case.

The McDonagh brothers had been traveling throughout the Pacific Northwest, scamming vulnerable homeowners with claims they needed unnecessary repairs. The FBI investigation linked the brothers to similar contractor fraud and complaints in Washington County, Oregon and Spokane, Washington, totaling about \$50,000. They are currently incarcerated in federal prison in SeaTac.
