Come out and celebrate the highly anticipated completion of the 8.5-mile stretch of light rail track connecting Shoreline to Lynnwood. This Friday from 4pm to 8pm the South/148th Station, Shoreline North/185th Station, Mountlake Terrace Station and Lynnwood City Center Station will be all celebrating their grand openings. Board the 1 Line and enjoy the food trucks, a lively night market, community partner booths, live music, and much more!

According to John Gallagher, a spokesperson for Sound Transit, the trip from Lynnwood to Seattle will take about half an hour via Link light rail. During peak hours, it will run every eight minutes from the new stations.

If you're lucky, you might see Captain Angelo, K9 Handlers Jurado and Fenton and their dogs, Rain and Shadow at the celebration!
