King's School Campus Tour



On Monday, 12/2/24, Captain Woodruff and CSO Corona had the privilege to tour the King's Schools and the CRISTA campus.

It is a very impressive campus with a rich history. It was originally the Firland Tuberculosis Sanatorium, opening in 1911. This site relocated to Seattle in 1947. Two years later, the sanatorium became King's Garden and opened as a home to youth in dormitories. Soon, King's Schools was formed to meet the youth's educational needs. The schools just celebrated the school's 75th anniversary.

The schools are preschool-12th grade. The CRISTA campus also houses senior living, a radio station, and other supporting services.
