Meeting Summary

Meeting started at 6:30 pm.

1. Welcome/Introductions

Kirk

Kirk McKinley welcomed everyone and introduced himself. Members of the ABC Team and staff members introduced themselves. Kirk reviewed the meeting agenda.

2. Hazardous Materials/Noise/Economics Wrap Up

Kris

Kris Overleese reviewed the meeting materials for the meeting. She informed the ABC Team that Greg Easton and Grant Gladow of Property Counselors are currently interviewing people for the Economics technical report. She also explained that Jennifer Barnes and the team from Jones and Stokes are in the process of taking noise readings for the Noise discipline report.

Kris opened the floor for additional comments about hazardous materials, noise and economics. The ABC Team and staff discussed vegetation impacts to businesses, both positive and negative, vegetation options for the corridor and the intent of the expanded economics study underway.

Kris explained that staff will prepare an issues matrix identifying the ABC Team member comments. This matrix will outline comments received and will act as a tool for members to track City responses. This matrix will be distributed at the next meeting.

3. Scoping Results

Jennifer

Jennifer Barnes explained the status of the scoping report. She reviewed the process to date. She directed the team's attention to the preliminary summary of scoping comments, included with the meeting packet. She explained the methodology for the summarization process and how and when comments will be addressed in the environmental reports. The ABC Team and staff discussed the nature of the comments received, the contents of the scoping report, and how the environmental analysis will be used to assist the City Council in selecting a preferred alternative.

4. Transportation

John

Kris introduced John McKenzie and Tim Newkirk of CH2MHill. CH2MHill developed the design for the three alternatives and are preparing the Transportation discipline report for the project. John reviewed the transportation goals for the project, the purpose of the transportation and traffic study, the methodologies for the traffic and safety studies and the findings so far. The ABC Team and staff discussed the assumptions utilized in the traffic modeling, the data collection measures, roadway and intersection design, data requirements for the model, the impacts of similar projects on SR 99, and multiple modes of travel on the roadway. John presented a traffic simulation model for the intersection at North 185th Street with the proposed improvements, using 2030 traffic volumes.

Kris reminded the team that the topic of the next meeting is construction, which will be an opportunity for team members to provide feedback on all aspects of construction.
