Echo Lake Neighborhood Traffic Action Plan

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INTRODUCTION

The Echo Lake Neighborhood Traffic Action Plan is a cooperative effort between City staff and residents to develop a list of projects to improve safety, mobility and livability of the neighborhood. The process to develop the plan was designed to give residents an opportunity to actively work with the City to identify key transportation issues, evaluate potential solutions and develop a list of prioritized recommendations which could be used to guide both short and long term improvements to the neighborhood.

Recognizing the impact traffic can have on the livability of neighborhoods, Shoreline Public Works initiated a planning effort to work with each of the City's 13 neighborhoods to develop plans that would address neighborhood transportation issues specific to each community. The recommendations in these plans will be used to guide future pedestrian and traffic improvements and help identify potential mitigation measures for larger projects being planned in Shoreline.




Figure 1: Echo Lake Neighborhood Planning Boundary

Echo Lake was the fourth neighborhood selected to work with the City to develop a Neighborhood Traffic Action Plan. The neighborhood is roughly bounded on the north by NE 205th Street, I-5 to the east, NE 185th St to the south; and Aurora Ave N on the west. Within the study area are Echo Lake Elementary, Shoreline Center, and businesses along Aurora. In addition, Costco and other major businesses are just to the north of the neighborhood. The study area is shown in Figure 1.

The planning process commenced in Winter 2007 and was completed in Spring 2007. The City held two community meetings, inviting residents to come and identify specific issues or concerns they had regarding pedestrian and traffic safety issues. Residents used survey cards provided at the meetings to submit their input and concerns. The City also included concerns previously identified by the community through the City's Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program.

A Neighborhood Traffic Advisory Committee comprised of volunteer residents from the neighborhood was created to work with the City to develop the plan. The City met several times with the Neighborhood Traffic Advisory Committee, Police and Fire Department representatives and School District representatives to develop and prioritize recommendations. The preliminary recommendations were presented to the larger community at an open house where final input was received.

The City has already completed some of the recommendations in the plan, and additional recommendations are scheduled for completion in 2009. Recommendations will be implemented on an on-going basis, as funding sources are identified. The Echo Lake Neighborhood Traffic Action Plan is considered to be an active working plan, and the City recognizes that new issues and concerns will arise in the future. As a result, it is recommended that the plan be revisited periodically to update and revise recommendations as needed.

The following chapters of the plan include *Planning Process* which describes the process and timeline for developing the plan, *Neighborhood Traffic Issues* which identifies traffic issues by street and summarizes key traffic, pedestrian and bicycle issues, *Neighborhood Recommendations* which describe the specific recommendations by street and summarizes key traffic bicycle and pedestrian elements, and *Implementation* which identifies potential opportunities for funding



projects identified in the plan. Additional supporting documentation may be found in the attached *Appendix*.

THE PLANNING PROCESS

The planning effort began with a community meeting in September 2006. City staff spoke with the Echo Lake Neighborhood Association and residents providing information about the effort to create a Neighborhood Traffic Action Plan for Echo Lake. Residents were asked to fill out survey cards to identify any concerns they had regarding neighborhood traffic, pedestrian or bicycle safety.

Each issue was given an identification number and entered into an *Echo Lake Neighborhood Plan Issue Matrix* which would enable staff to track each response and future follow-up actions. City staff investigated the concerns that were identified. Solutions that required no additional community coordination were implemented, such as trimming vegetation or installing parking restrictions for improved visibility and safety.

The City asked for volunteers to serve on a Neighborhood Traffic Advisory Committee to work with City staff to evaluate issues and develop recommendations for the plan. The newly-formed Neighborhood Traffic Advisory Committee included 8 residents who participated in the development of the plan.

Through a series of seven meetings in the winter of 2007, City staff and the Advisory Committee met to discuss key transportation issues, evaluate options and develop specific recommendations. At the first meeting, City staff discussed the role and responsibilities of the Neighborhood Traffic Advisory Committee, provided members with copies of the issues identified by the community, and information on commonly used tools and techniques for addressing various types of neighborhood traffic issues. City staff discussed the importance of looking at a variety of approaches when developing solutions, in particular focusing on the three E's of problem solving: engineering, education, and enforcement.

At the following meetings, City staff and the committee reviewed the various issues identified by residents, and discussed potential causes and solutions in the context of the broader community. Representatives from the Shoreline Police Department and Fire Department attended many of the meetings to answer questions and provide additional input. After the committee had developed recommendations for the plan, members ranked each identified project as a high, medium, or low priority for the neighborhood.

On April 17th, 2007, a community open house was held at the Shoreline Center to present the proposed Neighborhood Traffic Action Plan recommendations and solicit input from the broader community. City staff and Advisory Committee members were available to answer questions and explain the planning process. Attendees were asked to fill out a questionnaire to



determine the level of community support for the recommendations developed in the plan. Results of the surveys showed that over 85% of those that filled out the survey indicated they supported the plan.



ECHO LAKE NEIGHBORHOOD TRAFFIC ISSUES

Echo Lake residents filled out survey cards available at community meetings to identify concerns they had regarding neighborhood traffic issues, along with pedestrian and bicycle safety issues. In addition, City Staff included historical concerns identified by residents through the city's Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program (NTSP) which works with residents to address neighborhood traffic safety concerns. The following section presents the issues, listed by street, identified by residents.

Traffic Related Issues Summary

As with many neighborhoods, traffic speed and cut-through traffic is of concern throughout the Echo Lake neighborhood. Additionally, the neighborhood is concerned with the major redevelopment just south of Echo Lake where a trailer park is being redeveloped to include a large number of housing units including senior housing facilities, a YMCA, and retail. The community is concerned that existing traffic and safety conditions would be exacerbated with the redevelopment project.

Three streets of particular concern are Ashworth Ave N, 1st Ave NE, and N 192nd Street. Ashworth Ave N is a neighborhood collector arterial with a speed limit of 30 mph that runs from N 185th St to the Costco shopping area on N 200th St. It is a narrow unimproved roadway without sidewalks on either side, except for a few disconnected segments where new development was required to install frontage improvements. In addition to being used as a primary neighborhood access route, residents state that Ashworth Ave N is used by many motorists as an alternate route to Aurora Ave N. Because Ashworth Ave N is adjacent to Echo Lake Elementary, which is a key pedestrian destination for the neighborhood, there is a strong desire for improving pedestrian safety along Ashworth Ave N near the school.

First Ave NE is a collector arterial that runs north and south through the neighborhood and provides access to the Shoreline Conference Center, Shoreline swimming pool, and playfields. The speed limit between NE 205th St and NE 195th St is 35 mph; however, between N 195th and N 185th Streets, the speed limit is reduced to 25 mph. Residents expressed concern that southbound motorist fail to recognize or obey the reduced speed limit. They would like to implement improvements that will encourage drivers to slow down on this ten block section and raise awareness of the increased number of pedestrians crossing the street.

Speed and cut-through traffic on N 192nd St is also a concern for the neighborhood. N 192nd St is classified as a local access street with a 25 mph speed limit, and is the only east-west route between N 185th and N 200th Street which directly connects Aurora Ave N to Ashworth Ave N, Meridian Ave N, and 1st Ave NE. In 2006, speed humps were installed on N 192nd St between Aurora and Ashworth Ave N as part of the Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program effort. While the speed humps helped reduce speeds, residents expressed concern with the potential for traffic to increase when the redevelopment of a former trailer park located on the northeast corner of N 192nd St and Aurora is completed. The residents would like improvements to minimize any potential traffic impacts to the surrounding community.

Other streets that were identified as a concern were N 200th Street between Aurora Ave N and Meridian Ave N, and Midvale Ave N from N 185th to N 188th St. N 200th St is one of the primary access routes for the Costco retail property and for the Metro Transit Station located at N 200th St and Ashworth Ave N. Midvale Ave N and N 188th St are local access streets and will become the main entrance for Sky nursery. Sky Nursery is remodeling and will be changing their entrance from Aurora to Midvale Ave N. Residents are concerned that the new entrance will result in increased traffic through the neighborhood, particularly N 188th Street.




Pedestrian Related Issues Summary

Pedestrian safety is a primary concern for many Echo Lake residents. Residents' concerns about the lack of sidewalks or pedestrian facilities were typically coupled with concerns of high traffic speeds and volume. The major pedestrian generators in the neighborhood include Echo Lake Elementary school, the Interurban Trail, and a major development project near Aurora Ave N and N 192nd Street.

The lack of sidewalk around Echo Lake Elementary is a key issue for the neighborhood. Currently there is a short section of walkway on the east side of Ashworth Ave N immediately next to the school. There are also some sidewalk segments on the west side.

The lack of sidewalk on N 192nd St between Aurora Ave N and 1st Ave NE is also a concern. N 192nd St runs south of the school and is used as a major connection to a park-n-ride on Aurora and to Shoreline Center on 1st Ave NE. The community is concerned that as the redevelopment at N 192nd St and Aurora is completed, there will be more seniors and children using the street.



ECHO LAKE NEIGHBORHOOD RECOMMENDATIONS

The following section presents the recommendations, listed by street, developed for the Echo Lake neighborhood. The rationale and details for various recommendations is included. Summaries for traffic and pedestrian recommendations follow at the end of this section, along with the *Neighborhood Plan Recommendations* map illustrating the plan recommendations. An *Echo Lake Neighborhood Plan Issue Matrix* detailing the complete list of issues identified through the residents' survey cards along with the plan recommendation are located in the *Appendix*.

Ashworth Ave N

Recommendations:

- Re-stripe centerline on Ashworth Ave N with single yellow skip line
- Increase police enforcement and utilize radar speed displays
- Install walkway on east side of Ashworth Ave N from N 185th St to N 200th St
- Install walkway on west side of Ashworth Ave N from N 185th St to N 200th St
- Restrict parking on SE corner of Ashworth Ave N and 192nd St to improve visibility
- Monitor intersection of Ashworth Ave N and N 200th St for future all-way stop

Ashworth Ave N is a neighborhood collector arterial with a posted speed limit of 30 mph. It runs from N 185th St to the Costco shopping area at N 200th St. Residents are concerned about cut-through traffic and speeds along this route because it runs adjacent to Echo Lake Elementary School. To help make the street look less like an arterial route, the recommendation is to remove the solid double yellow center line and install a single yellow skip stripe. In addition, the community would like increased speed enforcement and use of radar speed display signs to help encourage motorists to drive the speed limit.

Many residents expressed concerned about an increase in traffic on Ashworth Ave N, due to the redevelopment of a former trailer park located at Aurora Ave N and N 192nd St. To direct traffic exiting from the new development to Aurora and out of the neighborhood, the new development is required to install a center median island and curbing on N 192nd St to restrict right turns from the development site.

Ashworth Ave N is a primary pedestrian connector for the neighborhood because of it's proximity to several pedestrian destinations in the neighborhood such as the Echo Lake Elementary School, Interurban trail, Metro Transit station and the retail complex on N 200th St. Currently there is one block of walkway on the east side of the street adjacent to the school. The community would like to enhance pedestrian accessibility by constructing walkways on both sides of Ashworth Ave N from N 185th St to N 200th St. The highest priority segment is the east side of the street from N 185th St to N 192nd St, where it would connect to the school and the existing asphalt walkway. The next highest priority is the west side from N 195th to N 200th St.

The intersection of N 192nd St and Ashworth Ave N is of particular interest to the neighborhood. With the completion of the Interurban trail and the redevelopment of the former trailer park on N 192nd St, the community anticipates increased pedestrian activity at this intersection. To improve driver and pedestrian visibility, parking should be restricted on the SE corner to improve visibility. In addition, traffic and pedestrian conditions after the development is completed should be monitored to determine if installation of additional pedestrian enhancements at N 192nd St, such as marked crosswalks or an all-way stop, would be appropriate.

Meridian Ave N

Recommendations:

- Enhance existing crosswalk on Meridian Ave N at N 192nd St
- Trim vegetation on the SE corner of N 192nd St to improve pedestrian and driver visibility
- Evaluate Meridian Ave N and N 200th St for left turn signal
- Install street light at Meridian Ave N & N 203rd St to improve night time visibility

Meridian Ave N is a minor arterial street and is one of the primary access routes through the neighborhood. Residents expressed visibility and pedestrian concerns at two intersections on this route, N 192nd St and N 200th St. To improve visibility for motorists and pedestrians at N 192nd St, vegetation on the SE corner should be trimmed, an overhead crosswalk sign installed, and the intersection evaluated for curb bulbs to enhance existing crosswalk. The intersection of 200th and Meridian Ave N should also be evaluated for a left turn phase.

Midvale Ave N

Recommendations:

Connect Midvale Ave N from dead end north of N 188th St to N 192nd St

Midvale Ave N is a local access street roughly half a block east of Aurora Ave N and is used for primary access to Sky Nursery just north of N 185th St. Sky Nursery is currently remodeling their site which will include improving the entrance on Midvale at N 188th St. Residents are concerned that this will increase traffic on N 188th St and through the neighborhood. A signal recently installed at Midvale Ave N and N 185th St may help to encourage motorists to access the site by using N 185th St and Aurora Ave N. To further discourage traffic though the neighborhood and encourage use of Aurora, one of the recommendations is to connect Midvale Ave N to N 192nd St which will enable motorists to more directly access the existing traffic signal at N 192nd St and Aurora Ave N. In addition, the community would like the City to monitor traffic speeds and volumes on N 188th St and install traffic calming devices or access restrictions if traffic significantly increases.

Stone Ave N

Recommendations:

• Work with adjacent residents to identify a preferred traffic calming device, and install if appropriate

Residents along Stone Ave N have been participating in the Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program (NTSP) in an effort to reduce traffic speeds and discourage cut-through traffic. With the new development occurring at Aurora Ave N and N 192nd St and the remodeling of Sky Nursery at N 188th and Midvale Ave N, residents are concerned with the potential for increased traffic on Stone between N 185th and N 192nd St. The community would like the City to continue monitoring traffic conditions and work with adjacent residents through the NTSP to identify potential traffic calming devices and install any if appropriate.

Wallingford Ave N

Recommendations:

Install walkway on west side of Wallingford Ave N between N 192nd St and N 195th St

Wallingford Ave N is a local access street and is a walking route for Echo Lake Elementary students. The recommendation for this corridor is to construct a walkway on the east side of Wallingford Ave N between N 192nd St and N 195th St to improve pedestrian access to the school.

1st Ave NE

Recommendations:

- Relocate Shoreline pool sign further from roadway and adjust lighting
- Restrict parking on SW corner of 1st Ave NE and NE 191st St to improve pedestrian visibility
- Install walkway on the west side of 1st between NE 192nd St and 195th St
- Enhance signs & markings at NE 195th St to raise awareness of speed limit reduction
- Increase police enforcement and use radar display to reduce speeds

1st Ave NE is a collector arterial that runs north and south through the neighborhood and provides access to Spartan Recreation Center, playfields and a swimming pool. The speed limit north of N 195th St is 35 mph, but is reduced to 25 mph between N 195th St and N 185th St. Recommendations for this corridor include enhancing signs and pavement markings at NE 195th St to raise driver's awareness of the reduced speed limit and increased pedestrian activity associated with the recreational facilities. The community would like increased speed enforcement and use of radar speed display signs to encourage lower speeds. Another recommendation is to restrict parking near NE 191st St, relocate the current pool sign further from the roadway and adjust the lighting, to improve pedestrian visibility at the existing marked crosswalk.

In addition, constructing a walkway on the west side of 1st Ave NE between NE 192nd St and NE 195th St is a medium priority but important as it connects to existing sidewalks on the west side of 1st Ave NE and provides continuous pedestrian access to the park.

5th Ave NE

Recommendations:

- Install walkways on the east side of 5th Ave NE from NE 185th St to NE 205th St
- Trim vegetation on NE corner of 5th Ave NE and NE 185th to improve visibility
- Increase police enforcement and use radar speed displays
- Enhance crosswalk on 5th Ave NE at NE 195th St (low priority until bike/pedestrian access improved along NE 195th St)

5th Ave NE is a neighborhood collector arterial street that runs alongside I-5 and connects NE 185th St to NE 205th St. The community would like increased speed enforcement and use of radar speed sign displays to increase driver awareness of speed. Another recommendation is to improve visibility at NE 185th St by trimming the vegetation.

To enhance pedestrian access to the Shoreline Center and playfield, the recommendation is to construct a walkway on the east side of 5th Ave NE between NE 185th St and NE 205th St, with the priority being the segment between NE 185th St to NE 195th Street. Improving the crosswalk at NE 195th and 5th Ave NE is also desired to enhance the bicycle and pedestrian connection to the proposed walkway along N 195th St.

6th Ave NE

Recommendations:

• Install walkway on the west side of 6th Ave NE between NE 201st St and 7th Ave NE

6th Ave NE is a local access street that connects NE 201st St to 7th Ave NE. The recommendation for this corridor is to install a walkway on the west side of 6th Ave NE to improve pedestrian access for local residents in the immediate area.

N 185th St

Recommendations:

- Install signal at N 185th St & Midvale Ave N (to be completed in 2007)
- Increase police enforcement and use radar display to reduce speeds

N 185th St is a minor arterial street that runs along the southern boundary of the neighborhood. A traffic signal was installed at Midvale Ave N in 2007 as part of Interurban trail project. The signal will assist with ingress/egress to Sky Nursery. Some residents have expressed concerns about traffic speeds along N 185th St. The recommendation is for additional speed enforcement and installation of radar speed displays to educate motorists.

N 188th St

Recommendations:

- Monitor traffic after completion of nearby projects; if traffic worsens, work with residents to identify appropriate traffic calming devices
- Install walkway on N 188th St from Midvale Ave N to Ashworth Ave N
- Improve existing footpath on N 188th St between Ashworth Ave N & Densmore Ave N

N 188th St is a local access street that connects Midvale Ave N to Ashworth Ave N. Residents are concerned that traffic will increase with the completion of Sky Nursery's current remodeling project, which improves the entrance located on Midvale Ave N. The community would like the City to monitor traffic conditions on N 188th St. If traffic significantly increases after the Sky Nursery project is completed, then the community would like the City to work with residents on N 188th St to identify appropriate traffic calming alternatives.

N 192nd St

Recommendations:

- Install walkway on north side of N 192nd St from Aurora Ave N to Ashworth Ave N
- Install walkway on north side of N 192nd St from Ashworth Ave N to Wallingford Ave N
- Install walkway on one side of N 192nd St from Meridian Ave N to 1st Ave NE
- Trim vegetation as needed on SW corner of N 192nd St & Stone Ave N
- Restrict parking on SE corner at N 192nd St and Ashworth Ave N
- Re-time signal in 2007 with completion of Aurora project

Although N 192nd St is a classified as a local access street, it is one of the few continuous east-west routes between Aurora Ave N, Meridian Ave N and 1st Ave NE within the neighborhood. As a result, this route is used by many motorists to access several key destinations within the neighborhood such as the Interurban trail, Echo Lake Elementary School, and the Shoreline Center.

Residents have expressed concerns that traffic along this route will further increase with the construction of a new YMCA facility, senior housing complex and additional retail space at Aurora and N 192nd St. To mitigate these concerns, the development has been required to install curbing and a median on the centerline of N 192nd St to restrict left turns out of the site.

In 2006, as part of the Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program, two speed humps were installed between Aurora and Ashworth Ave N and a traffic circle constructed at Wallingford Ave N in an effort to reduce speed and volume along N 192nd St. A survey of the neighborhood in 2007 indicated that the community supports a permanent traffic circle.

Currently, there are only a few short segments of existing sidewalk along N 192nd St. To help improve pedestrian safety and accessibility through the neighborhood, the community would like a continuous walkway be constructed along one side of N 192nd St from Aurora to 1st Ave NE. A priority segment is the north side of N 192nd St from Aurora to Ashworth Ave N. Construction of this segment is anticipated to be complete in 2009 through the City's Walkway Capital Improvement Program and the Inland Development project. To improve access to Spartan Recreation, playfields and the pool, a lower priority recommendation is to construct a walkway on one side of N 192nd St between Meridian Ave N and 1st Ave NE and enhance the existing crosswalk at NE 192nd St and Meridian Ave N.

N 193rd St

Recommendations:

- Work with adjacent residents between 1st Ave NE and 5th Ave NE to identify appropriate traffic calming devices
- Consider installing a traffic circle at NE 193rd St and 3rd Ave NE

North 193rd Street is a local access street that connects Meridian Ave N to 5th Ave NE. Residents have expressed concerns with traffic and speeds along this route particularly with the recent installation of traffic circles on the adjacent streets of N 192nd and N 194th St at Corliss Ave N. The community would like the City, through the NTSP, to work with residents to evaluate traffic conditions and identify preferred traffic calming alternatives. Construction of a traffic circle at 3rd Ave NE should be considered if residents support it.

N 195th ST

Recommendations:

- Relocate "Dead End" sign on NW corner of N 195th St and Ashworth Ave N
- Work with school to develop student drop off and pick up plan
- Install walkway on one side of N 195th St from Wallingford Ave N to Meridian Ave N
- Install bike/pedestrian path along NE 195th ROW between Meridian Ave N and 5th Ave NE

North 195th St is a local access street that runs from Meridian Ave N to 7th Ave NE. Because of its connectivity to the Interurban trail on the west end and the pedestrian freeway overpass on the east, the neighborhood supports developing an east/west pedestrian bicycle route along this corridor. To facilitate this, the community would like a walkway constructed on the south side of N 195th St between Meridian Ave N and Ashworth Ave N, connecting to the existing sidewalk between Ashworth Ave N and Wallingford Ave N. A lower priority walkway should be considered for one side of N 195th St from Wallingford Ave N to Meridian Ave N and from 1st Ave NE Ave NE to the pedestrian overpass east of 5th Ave NE. In addition, the community would like a bicycle/pedestrian path along the unimproved right-of-way between Meridian Ave N. and 1st Ave NE. Once the walkways are

constructed, the community would like the City to evaluate the intersection at 5th Ave NE for potential improvements and enhance the pedestrian crossings at this intersection.

To improve traffic and pedestrian safety during school start and release times, the City should work with the school and police to discourage double parking on N 195th St and encourage parent compliance with school procedures for student drop off and pickup.

N 200th St

Recommendations:

- Install signs at Costco parking lot that indicate turning vehicles must stop for pedestrians
- Work with King County Metro to discourage Access van from blocking through traffic on eastbound lane
- Monitor N 200th St and Ashworth Ave N intersection for future all-way stop
- Increase police enforcement and use radar speed sign displays to reduce speeds
- Trim vegetation on southwest corner of N 200th St and Wallingford Ave N to improve stop sign visibility
- Remark crosswalks on N 200th St at Wallingford Ave N
- Install advance warning signs for existing all-way stop at Wallingford Ave N and install flashing beacons for east/west approach if needed

N 200th St is a collector arterial that connects Aurora Ave N to Meridian Ave N. Many motorists use this route to access the Costco retail site and Metro transit stations. Residents have expressed concerns with increased traffic volumes and speeds along this route as well as poor compliance at the existing all-way stop located at Wallingford Ave N. The posted speed limit is currently 25 mph, and traffic studies show approximately 8,000 cars per day. This is within anticipated range for a collector arterial. To increase compliance at the existing all-way stop, the community would like the City to install advance warning signs, remark crosswalks, and have the Police Department provide additional stop sign and speeding enforcement. If needed, flashing beacons could be installed to stop sign posts and radar speed displays installed to encourage lower speeds along N 200th St.

To enhance pedestrian safety at the signalized intersection adjacent to the Costco entrance, the community would like the City to install signs that indicate turning motorists must stop for pedestrians on the signal mast arms. This will increase motorist's awareness of pedestrian crossing activity. It is also recommended that the intersection of N 200th St and Meridian Ave N be evaluated to determine if adding a left turn phase to the existing signal is appropriate, and if additional pedestrian improvements are needed.

The City should work with King County Metro to conduct a site evaluation to determine appropriate drop-off and pick-up procedures for the Access Van and to discourage vans from blocking through traffic on the eastbound lane near Aurora Ave N.

N 203rd St

Recommendations:

- Continue work with adjacent residents to address speed concerns
- Consider installation of a traffic circle at N 203rd St and Burke Ave N
- Install street light on the northeast corner of N 203rd St and Burke Ave N

North 203rd Street is a local access street that connects Meridian Ave N with residential streets to the west. Although residents have expressed concerns about speed and cutthrough traffic on this street, traffic studies indicate relatively low speeds and volumes. The community would like the City to continue working with adjacent residents through NTSP to identify potential traffic calming measures and consider installation of a traffic circle at Burke Ave N and N 203rd St, if there is strong support by the residents. In addition, the community would like the City to work with the School District to encourage buses to use arterial routes when feasible.

To enhance pedestrian safety at night, a street light was recently installed on the NE corner of Burke Ave N and N 203rd St. Installation of an additional street light at N 203rd St and Meridian Ave N will be evaluated.

NE 205th St

Recommendations:

Improve pedestrian facilities along NE 205th St

NE 205th St is a state route west of I-5 and is not within Shoreline City boundaries; however the community expressed concern with the lack of infrastructure near the Metro Transit stop located on the south side of the street west of 6th Ave NE. A block wall recently constructed on the back side of the stop helped to provide a larger waiting area for riders further from the roadway edge. The community would like the City to work with King County and the State to construct a sidewalk along the south side of NE 205th St from 1st Ave NE to 6th Ave NE.

Traffic Recommendation Summary

As with many other neighborhoods, traffic speeds and volumes are a major concern for the community. The Echo Lake Neighborhood is home to many key destinations for both the local neighborhood and the broader city. These include: the Metro Transit station at Aurora Ave N and N 200th St; Spartan Recreation Center, playfields and swimming pool on 1st Ave NE; Echo Lake Elementary School at Ashworth Ave N and N 195th St; Sky Nursery at Aurora Ave N and N 188th St; a new YMCA facility located at Aurora Ave N and N 192nd St; the Costco retail site; and the Interurban Trail. All of these destinations contribute to the total traffic and traffic circulation within the neighborhood.

1st Ave NE is a collector arterial that runs north and south through the neighborhood and provides access to Spartan Recreation Center, playfields and swimming pool. Because of the increased pedestrian activity generated by the park facilities, the Echo Lake Neighborhood would like to reduce traffic speeds along 1st Ave NE. The posted speed limit has been reduced from 35 mph to 25mph south of N 195th St, adjacent to the park facilities. A combination of enforcement, education, and engineering efforts are recommended to address speed reduction issue. Enhancing advanced warning signs and installing pavement legends will raise drivers' awareness of the reduced speed limit at NE 195th Street. In addition, the community recommends that the City restrict parking near the existing pedestrian crossing to increase pedestrian visibility. For the same reason, the Shoreline Pool sign should be relocated further from the roadway.

Ashworth Ave N is of particular interest to the community because of its connections to businesses and transit on N 200th St as well as Echo Lake Elementary School. Ashworth is used by some motorists as an alternate route for Aurora Ave N. Because it is classified as a Neighborhood Collector route, the use of physical traffic calming devices such as speed humps and traffic circles, are not recommended. A less restrictive alternative is for the City to increase enforcement and utilize radar speed sign displays to educate motorists and encourage appropriate speeds. In addition, the community supports replacing the current solid double yellow centerline with a single yellow skip stripe and installing walkways along Ashworth Ave N. These walkways will help raise driver awareness of pedestrians and create the perception of a narrower street, which may encourage lower speeds.

The neighborhood is also concerned about traffic speeds and volumes on many local access streets such as N 192nd St and Stone Ave N. N 192nd St is one of a few continuous east-west routes through the neighborhood running from Aurora to 1st Ave NE. The signal located at the Aurora intersection may encourage motorists to use N 192nd St as a primary route into and out of the neighborhood. The City has been working with residents on N 192nd St to help reduce traffic speeds and volume. Two speed humps and a traffic circle were installed as part of the Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program (NTSP) effort in 2006. These helped to reduce speeds but had little impact on traffic volume. The plan recommends constructing walkways on N 192nd St to enhance pedestrian safety and create the perception of a narrower street, which may encourage lower speeds. Another recommendation is that the City continue monitoring traffic conditions and consider installing additional traffic calming devices if traffic volumes and speeds increase significantly. Additionally through the NTSP,

the City can work with residents to more thoroughly evaluate residents' traffic concerns along both Stone Ave N and N 193rd St and consider installing traffic calming devices, particularly a traffic circle at N 193rd St and 3rd Ave NE, if supported by surrounding residents.

Two other local access streets of concern to the neighborhood are Midvale Ave N and N 188th St. These streets are used to access Sky nursery which is currently remodeling their site and improving their entrance located at Midvale Ave N and N 188th St. Residents are concerned that the enhanced entrance will increase traffic through the neighborhood using N 188th Street. Extending Midvale Ave N to N 192nd St is identified as a high priority because it will encourage motorists exiting Sky Nursery to utilize the signal at Aurora and N 192nd St. The City has completed "before" traffic studies that includes speed and volume data on these two streets. The plan recommends that the City monitor traffic conditions after the completion of the project and consider installing traffic calming devices or access restrictions on NE 188th St between Midvale and Ashworth Ave N if traffic speeds or volumes significantly increase.

Pedestrian Recommendations Summary

Improvements to Echo Lake's pedestrian environment is a high priority. In particular, enhancing connections to the Interurban Trail and improving access to local destinations such as Echo Lake Elementary School, Spartan Recreation Center, playfields and swimming pool, and transit are a central theme of this plan. Strategies for improving pedestrian access include installation of sidewalks or walkways, along with measures to reduce traffic speed to facilitate pedestrian crossings.

N 192nd St, between Aurora and Ashworth Ave N is of particular concern. This route serves as a connection to the Interurban trail, transit on Aurora, and Echo Lake Elementary School. Currently, there is only a short segment of sidewalk on the south side, west of Stone. To improve access and safety on this route, a high priority recommendation is to construct a walkway on the north side of the street from Aurora to Ashworth Ave N. In 2008, the City will be installing a walkway on the north side between Ashworth Ave N and the Interurban Trail. The redevelopment project at Aurora and N 192nd St will complete the connection from the Interurban Trail to Aurora and construct an additional 300 feet of sidewalk on Aurora Ave N. To continue the pedestrian route eastward along N 192nd St, installing walkways on one side of N/NE 192nd St, from Ashworth Ave N to 5th Ave NE is a high priority. This will create an internal pedestrian circulation route for neighborhood residents and provide better access to the Spartan Recreation Center, playfields and swimming pool. In conjunction with the construction of walkways, the existing crosswalk at N 192nd St and Meridian Ave N should be enhanced to improve safety for pedestrians crossing this minor arterial street.


Ashworth Ave N is a neighborhood collector route and is another key connector to Echo Lake Elementary school. Consequently, the plan recommends constructing walkways on both sides of the street from N 185th St to N 200th St. The highest priority is the east side of Ashworth Ave N from N 185th St to N 192nd St, where it can connect to an existing asphalt

walkway that extends to N 195th St. The next highest priority is the west side of Ashworth Ave N from N 195th to N 200th St. This would provide improved access for students along this stretch of roadway as well as providing an additional connection to Echo Lake Park and the Transit Center located at N 200th St.

The intersection of Ashworth Ave N and N 192nd St is also a priority for pedestrian improvements. The community would like the City to monitor this intersection. As pedestrian and traffic patterns change, the City should evaluate installation of pedestrian enhancements such as marked crosswalks or an all-way stop to improve pedestrian safety and accessibility.

While walkways along N 192nd St will help to improve pedestrian accessibility to neighborhood destinations, the community also recognizes the potential to create a larger city and regional pedestrian and bicycle route along N 195th St. N 195th St extends from the Interurban trail on the west to the I-5 pedestrian overpass on the east. Construction of a continuous walkway on one side of N 195th St, which includes a pathway on the unimproved right-of-way between Meridian Ave N. and 1st Ave NE, would be an important segment in a larger bicycle and pedestrian route that would connect the Interurban trail to the Burke Gilman trail.

IMPLEMENTATION

The intent of this plan is to develop both long and short term recommendations that will improve the safety and livability of the neighborhood. Although there is no single source to fund the plan in its entirety, some recommendations have been or can be implemented quickly through the Neighborhood Traffic Safety program or the City's regular roadway maintenance budget. Other recommendations, such as the installation of physical devices or changes to the roadway will need strong community support and an identified funding source. Examples of typical funding sources are shown below.

Potential funding sources:

- Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program this program works directly with adjacent residents to improve neighborhood traffic safety
- Small Works Traffic Program this program funds spot improvements to improve traffic safety and mobility
- Walkway Priority Program this program funds construction of priority sidewalk routes as identified by the transportation master plan and neighborhood priorities
- Capital Improvement Process this process identifies funding needs for larger, capital projects
- Local Improvement District this program allows residents to raise funds through increased property tax for capital improvement projects
- Mitigation elements of the plan may be implemented as mitigation for larger development projects which occur throughout the neighborhood

Elements of the plan will be implemented over time as funding sources are identified and community support is demonstrated.

- We feel the Pedestrian and Traffic Impacts caused by open ditches on the west side of Ashworth from 185th to 195th warrants special funding (Small Works Traffic Program?) From Public Works to fill in the open area of the right-of-way and create a safe path of travel for school children, traffic, and hundreds of other pedestrians who walk this street on a weekly basis.
- Thank you for the traffic circles on N 194th and 192nd / Corliss! There's still a lot of congestion and danger around the pool and tennis courts with cars hunting for parking and pedestrians crossing 1st NE.
- West bound 190th and Meridian Church sign obstructs vision when making Northbound turn. Also hedge obstructs southbound turns. Improve pool crosswalk – visibility wise.

- The traffic "circle" at 192^{nd} and Wallingford is very difficult to use if you are going on Wallingford and want to go west on 192^{nd} .
